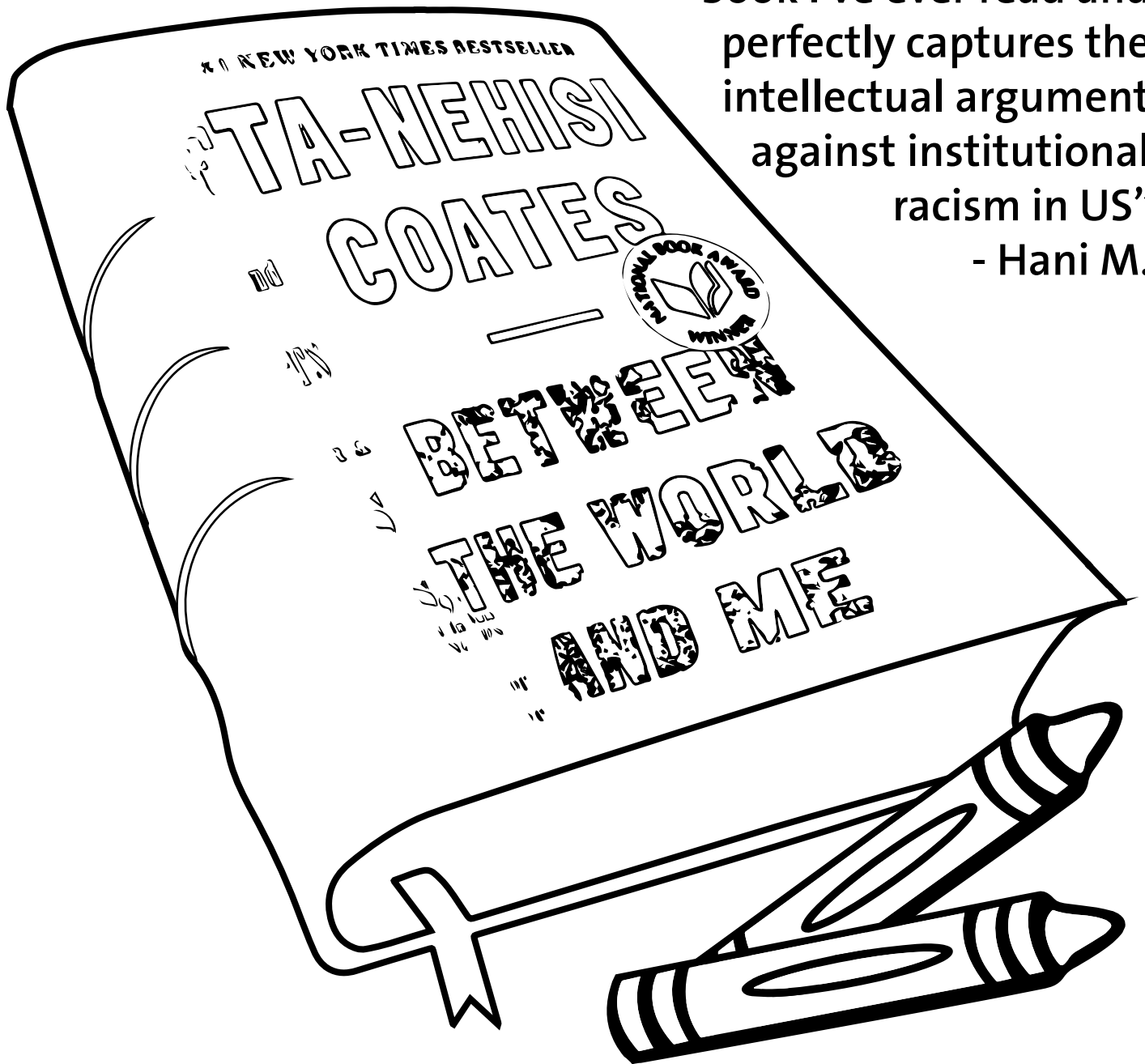

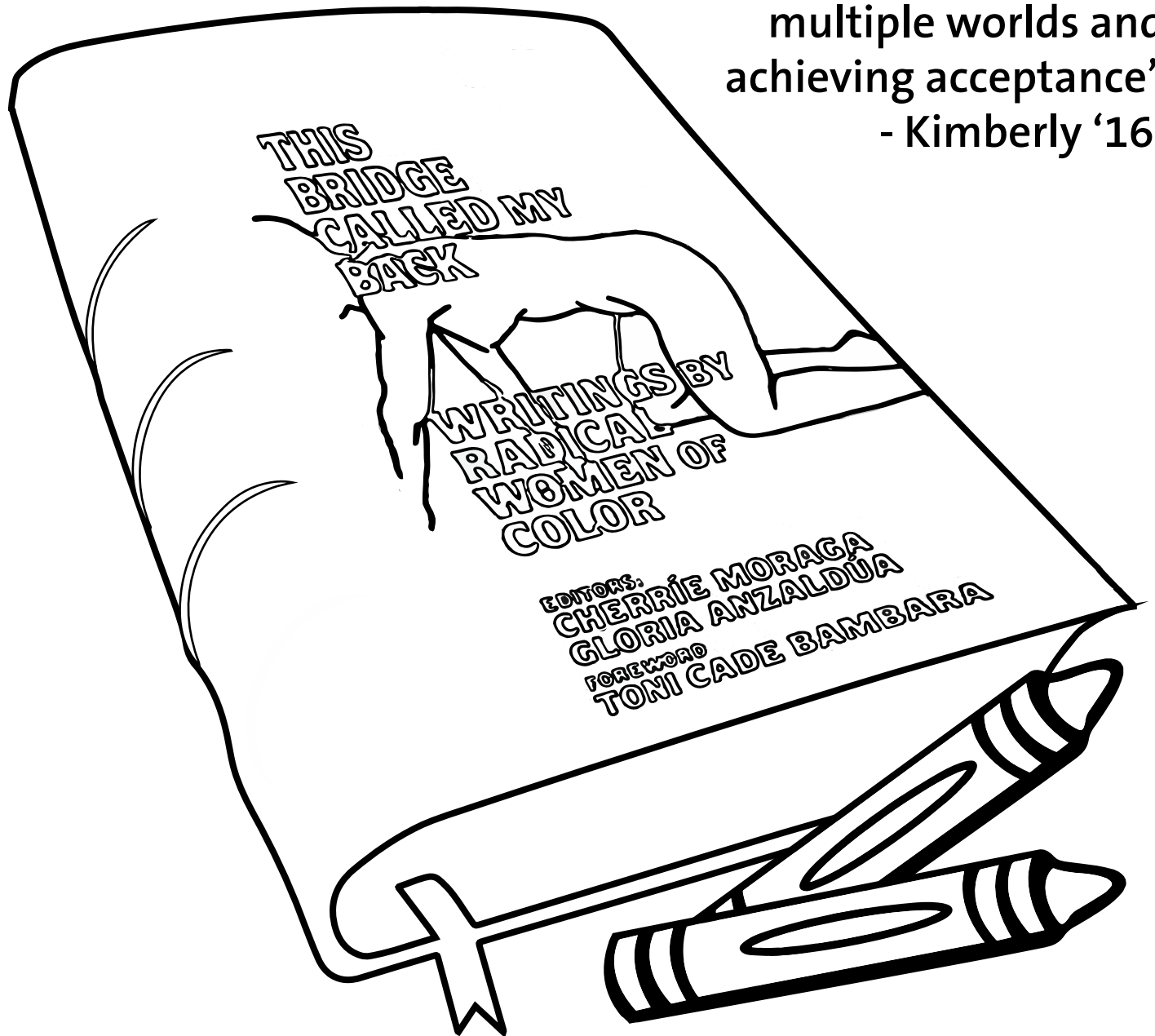

This Bridge Called My Back

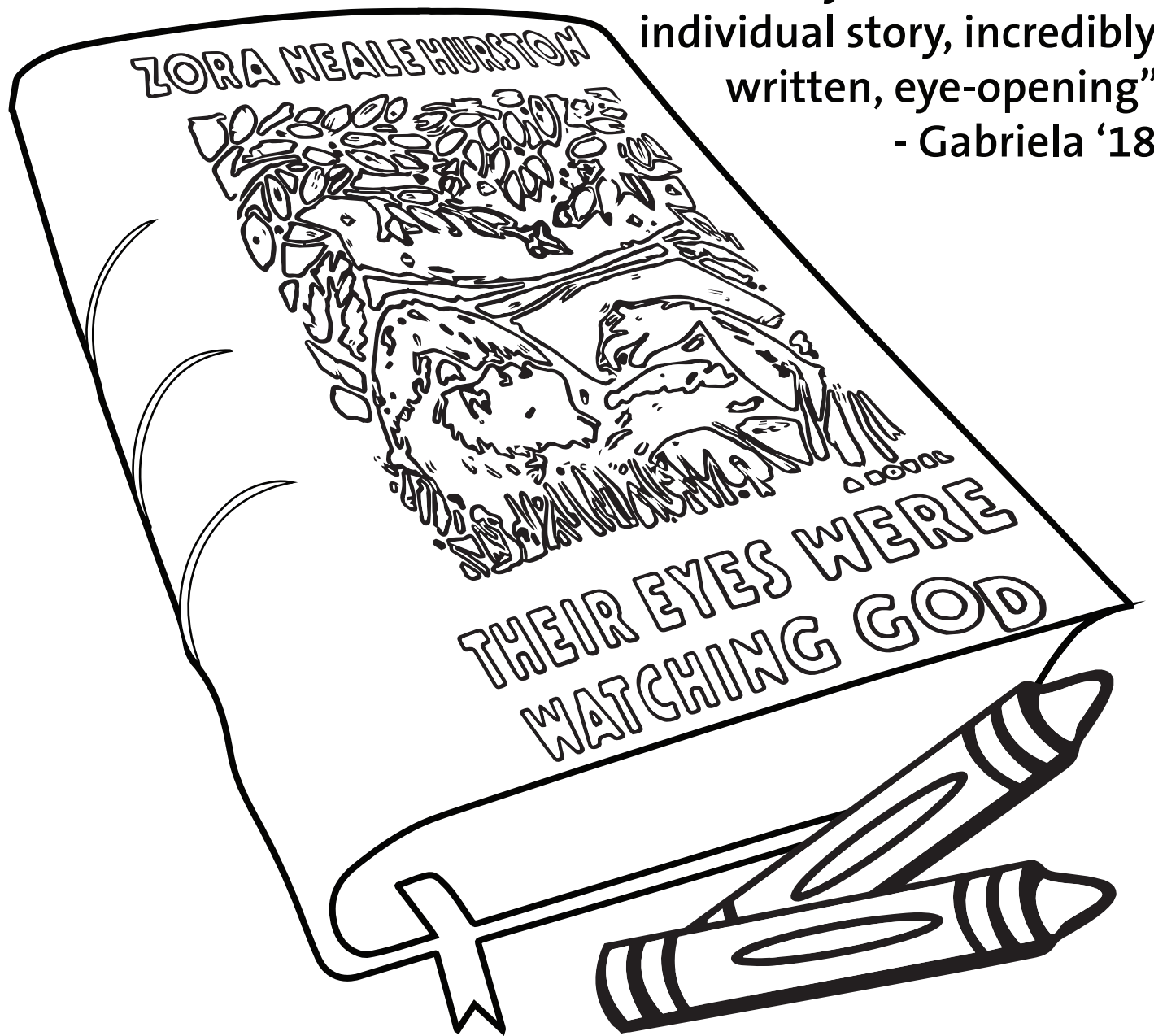

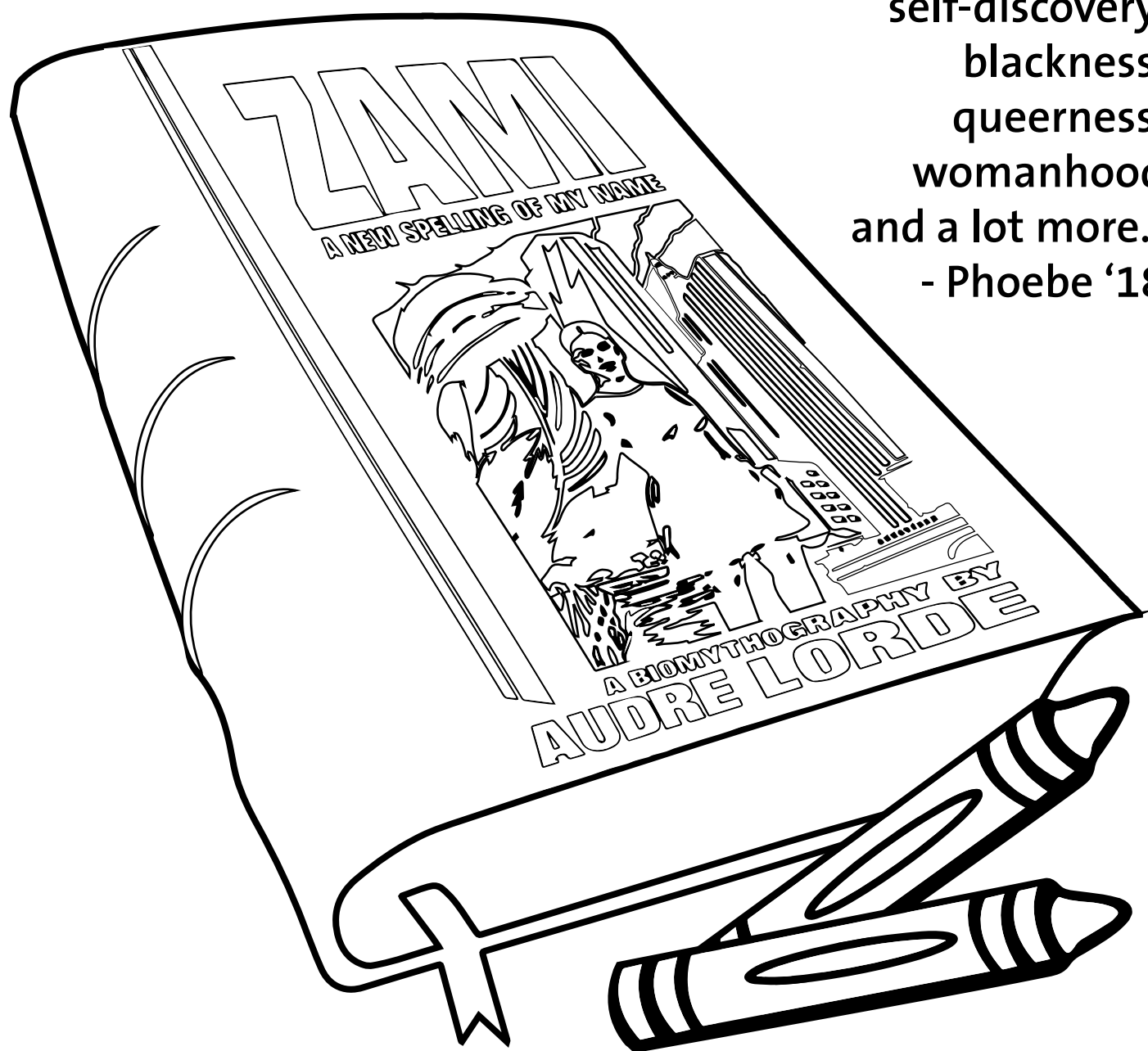

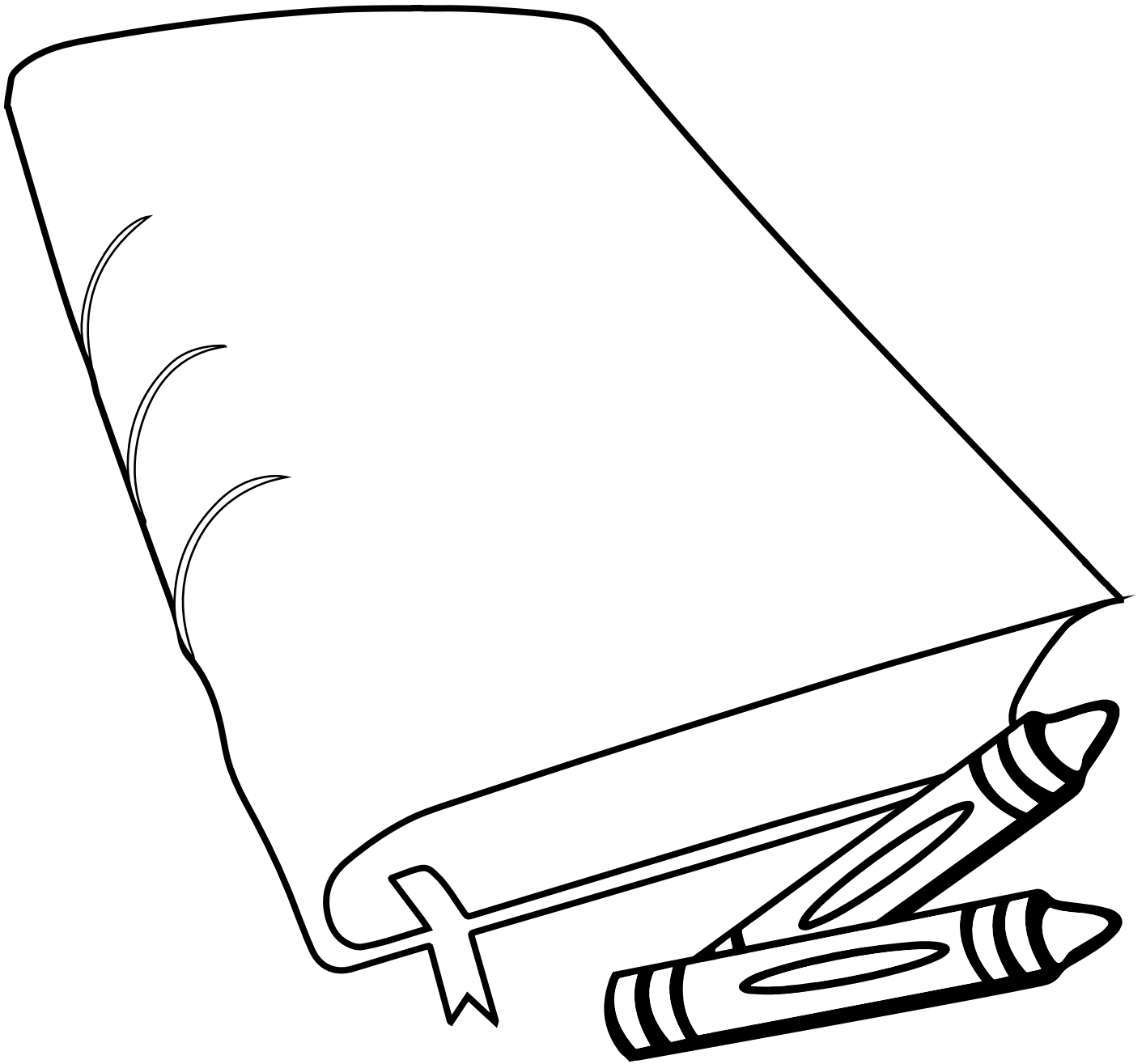
