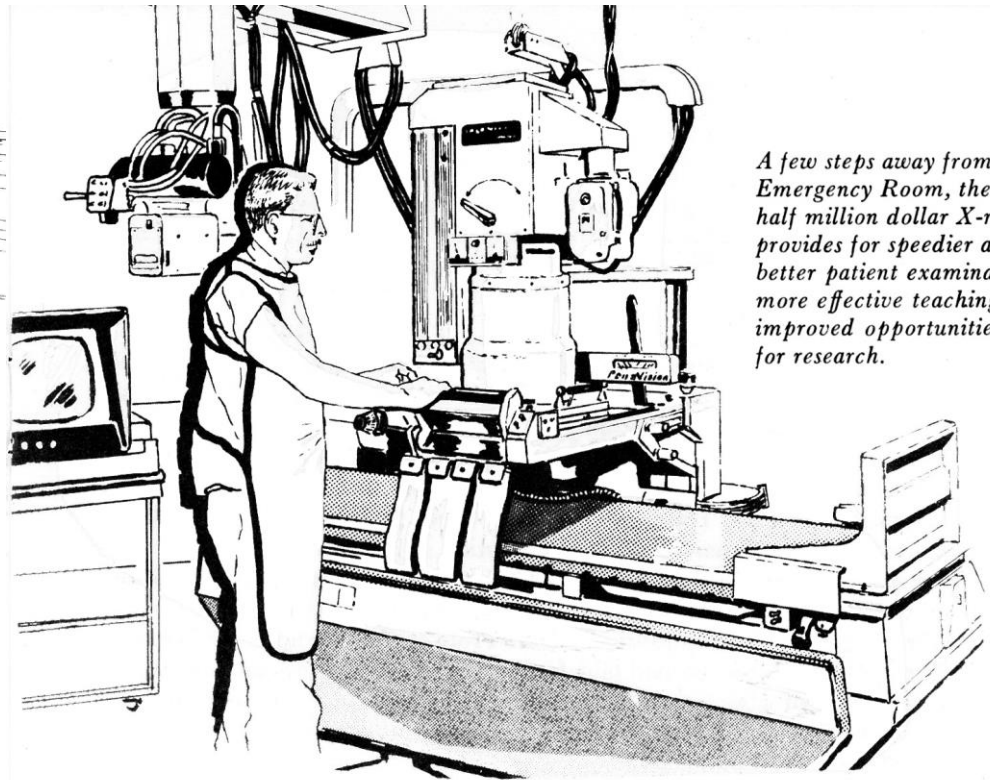
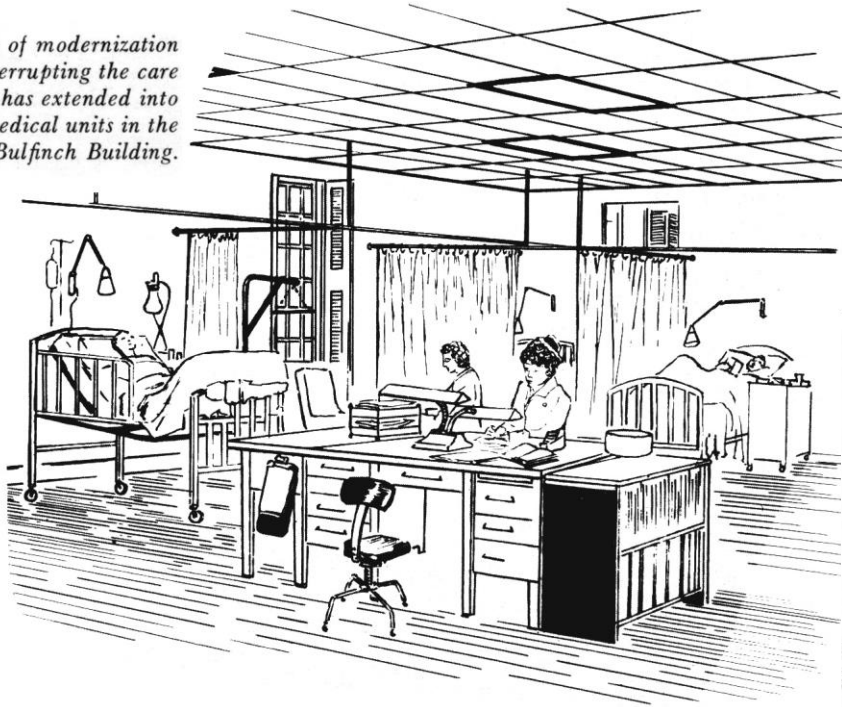


The complete renovation of the White Lobby was the beginning of an extensive plan to raise the standards of patient facilities throughout the Hospital.

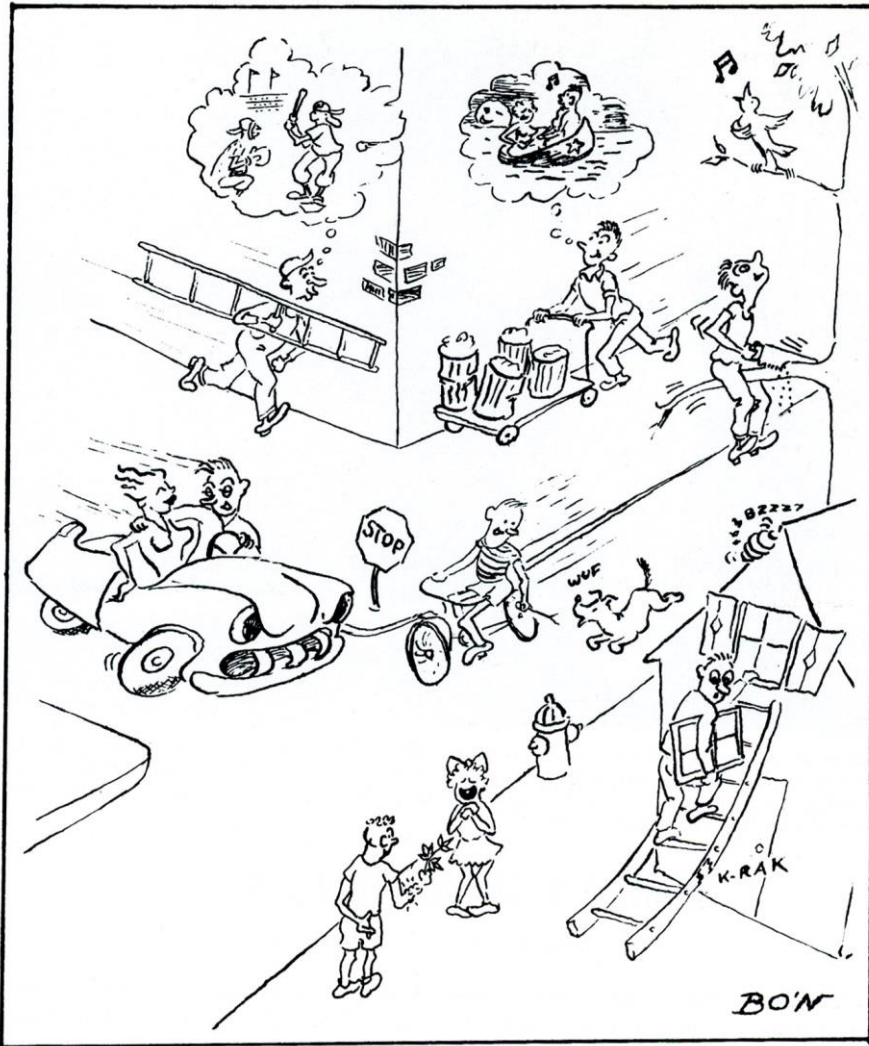

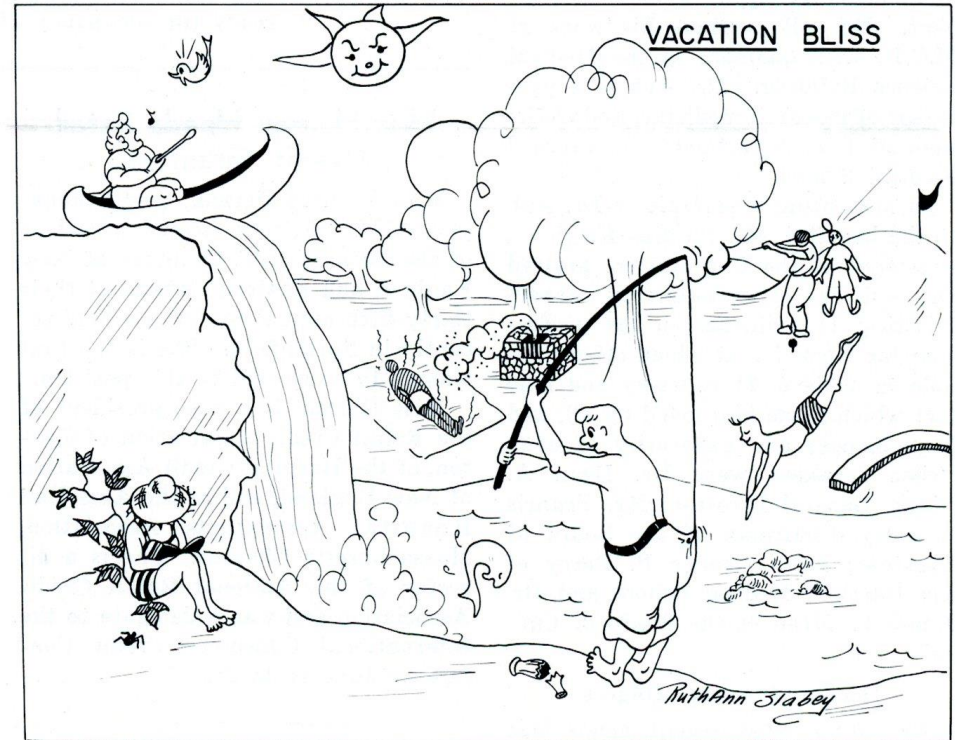

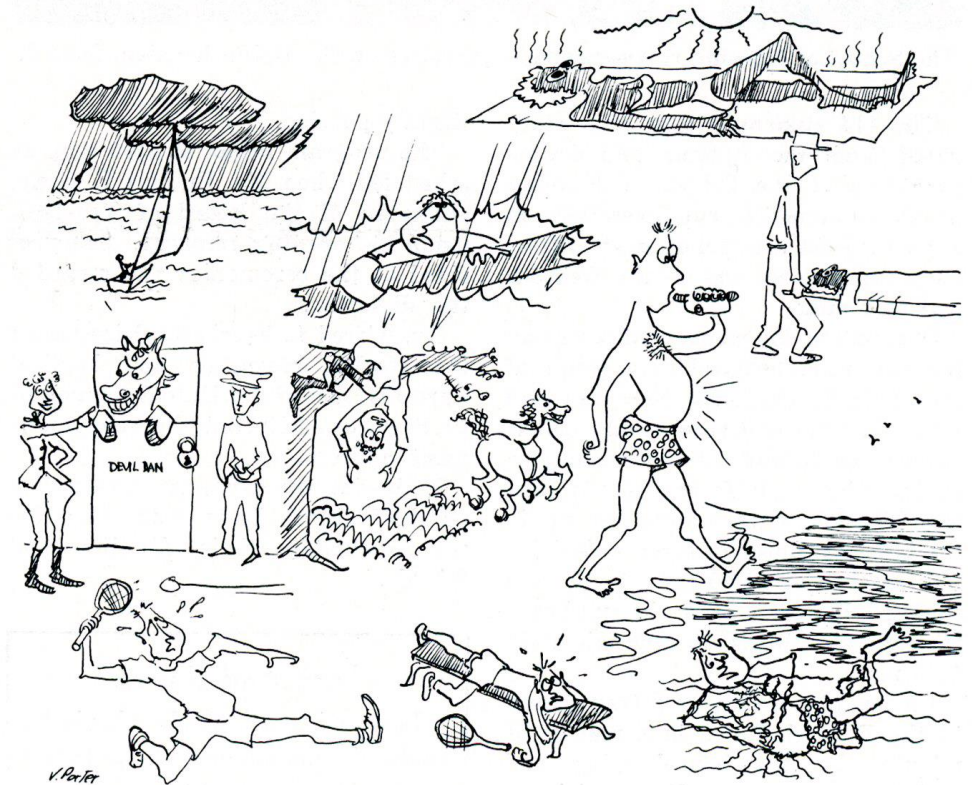

A Typical Day at M. G. H.

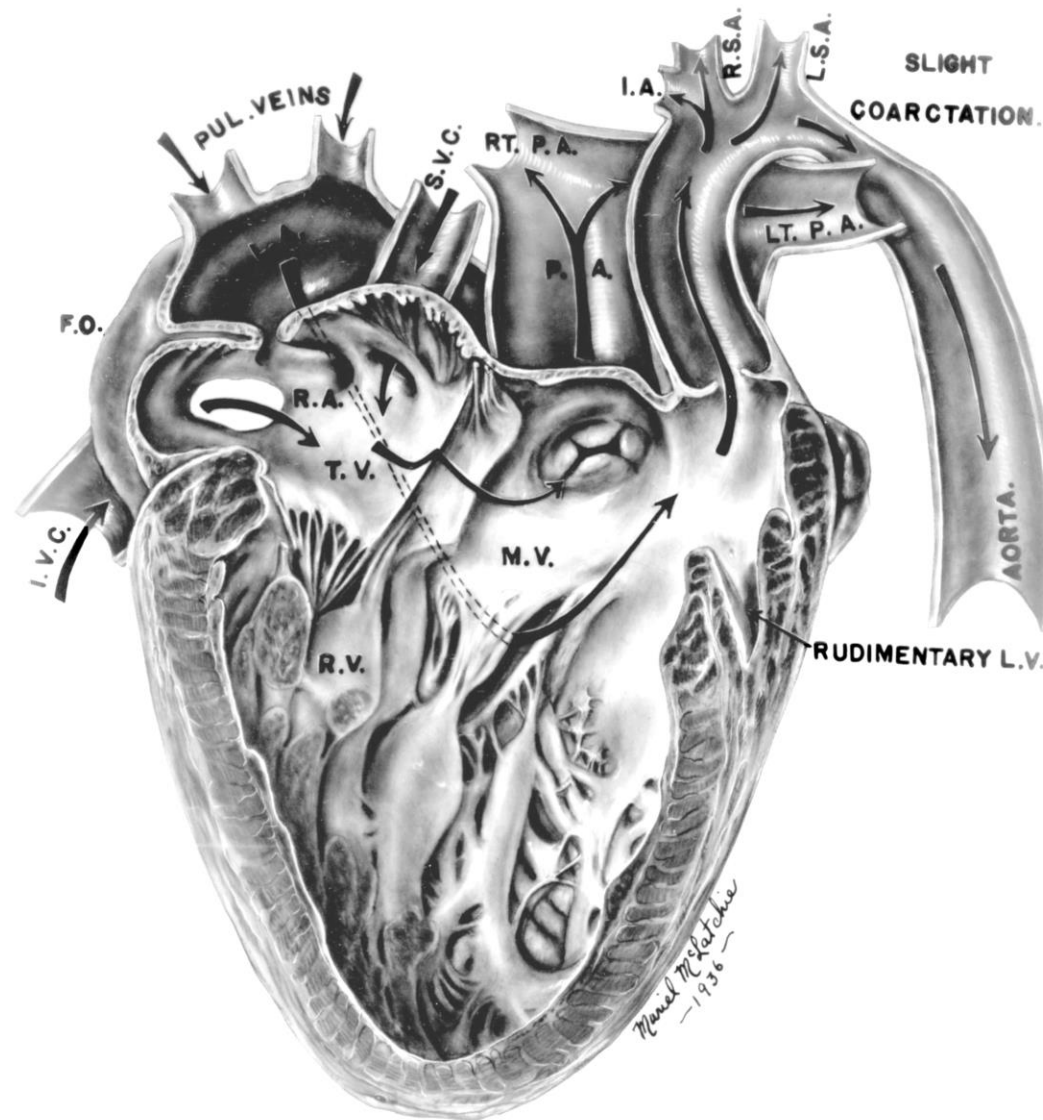
