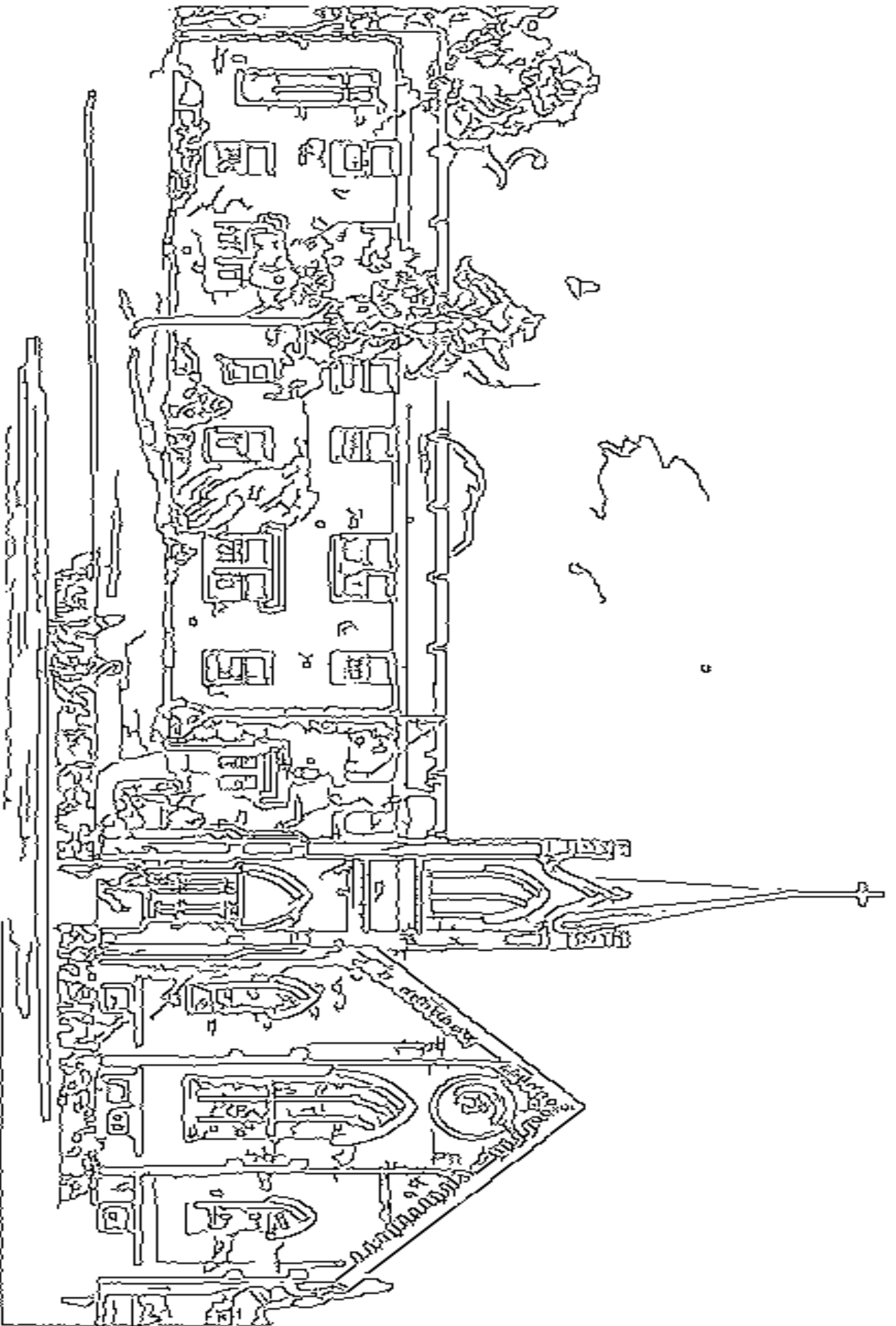

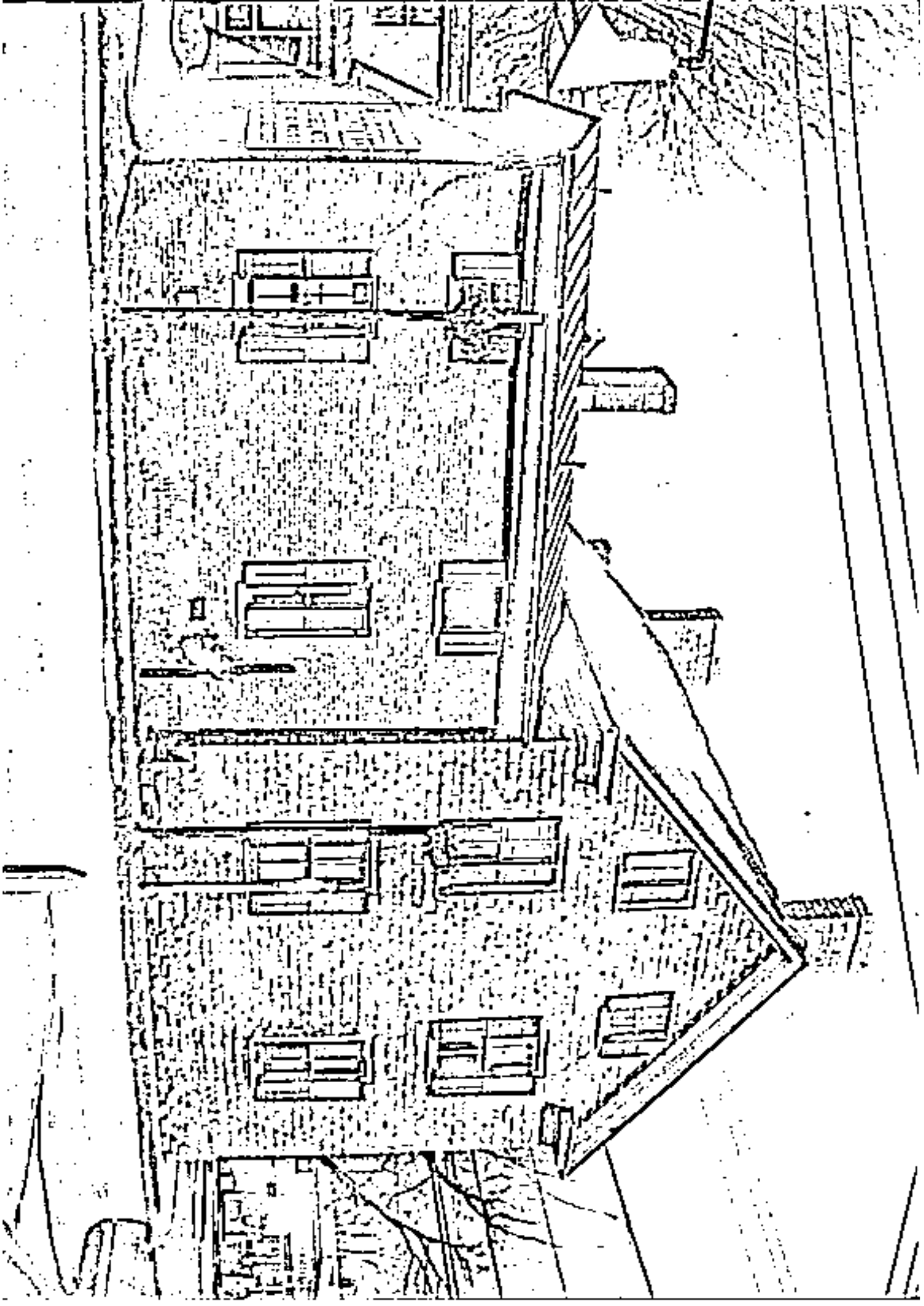

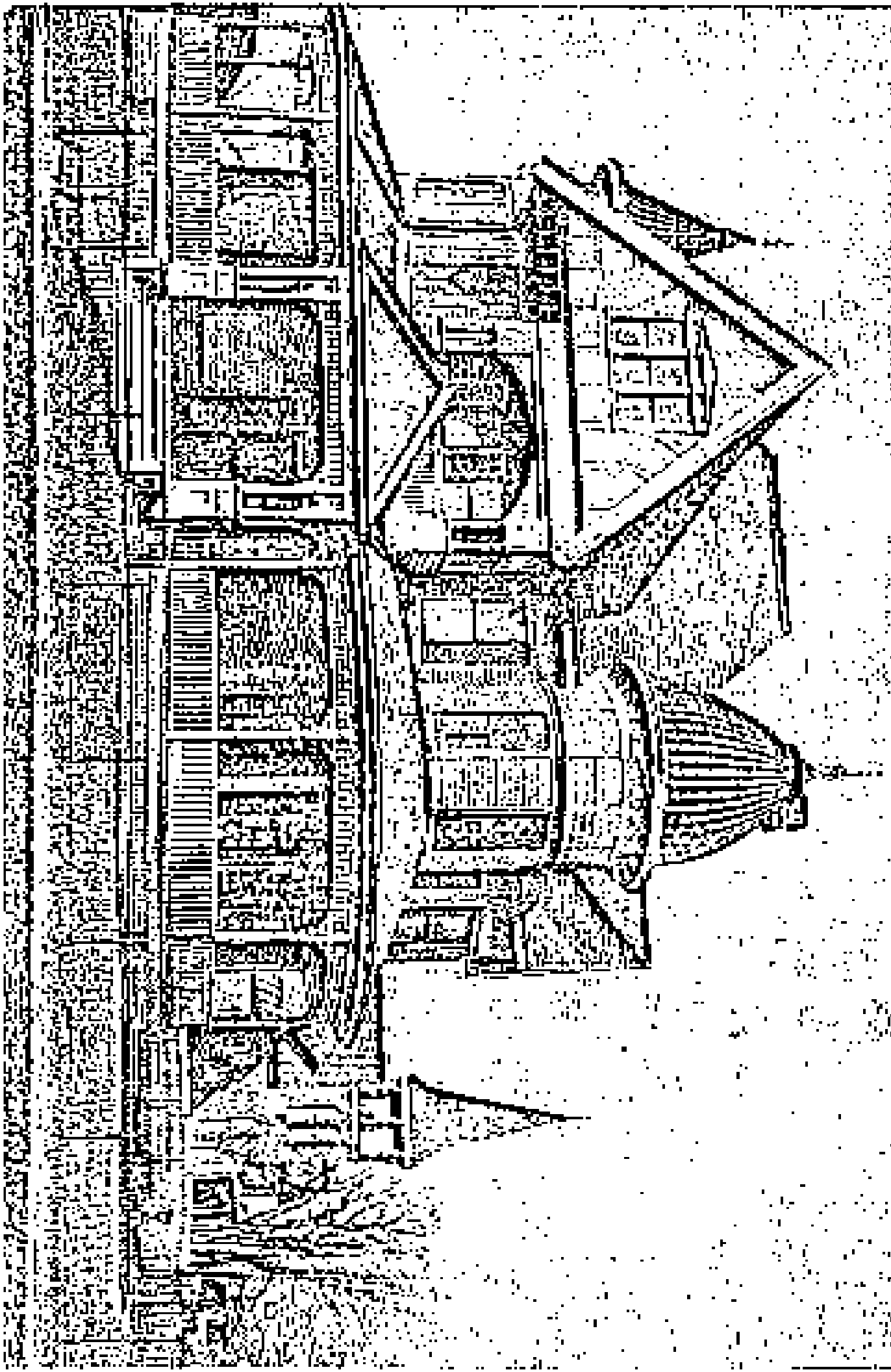

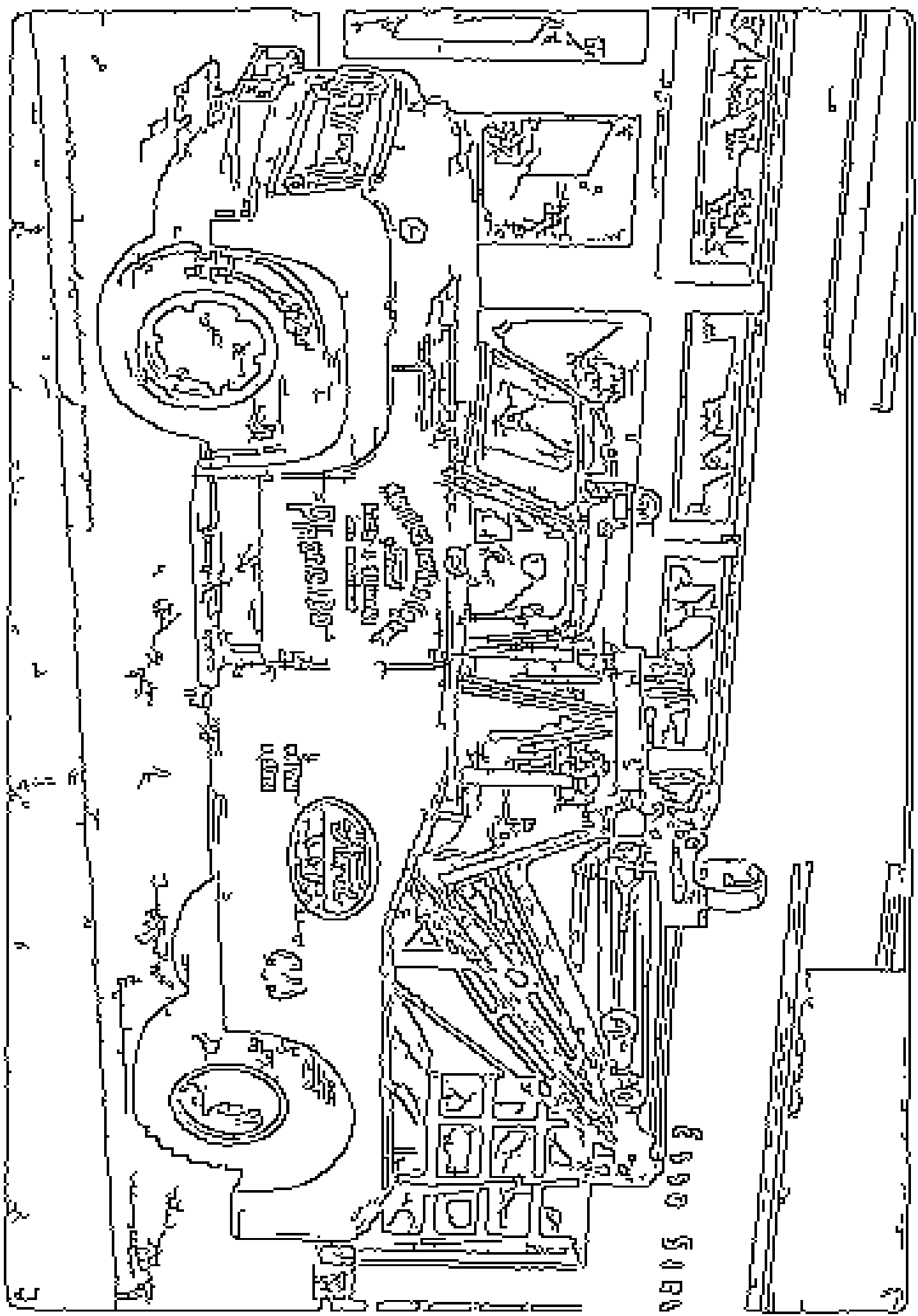

Residence of S. P. Lonas

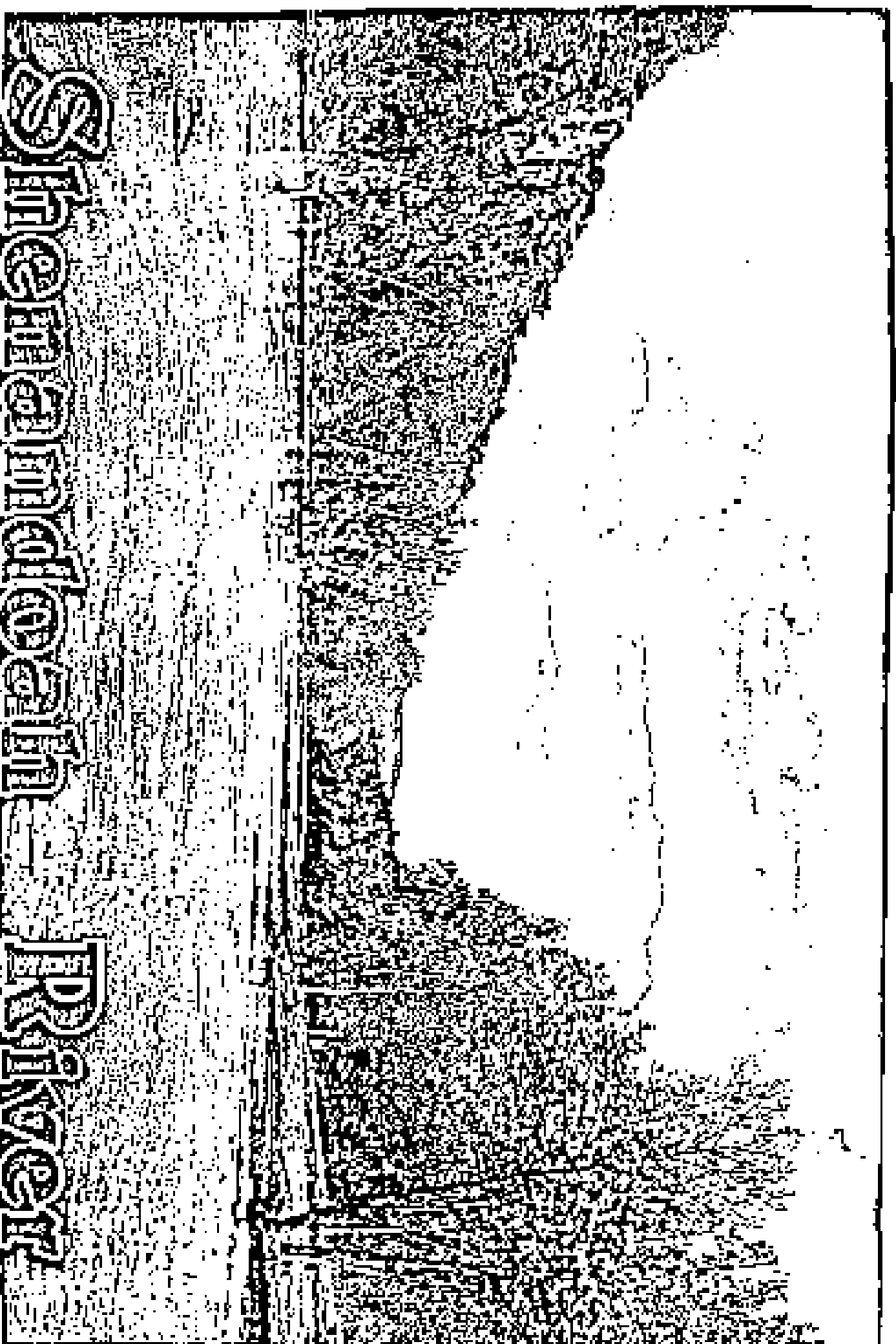
Mt. Jackson, Vt.
