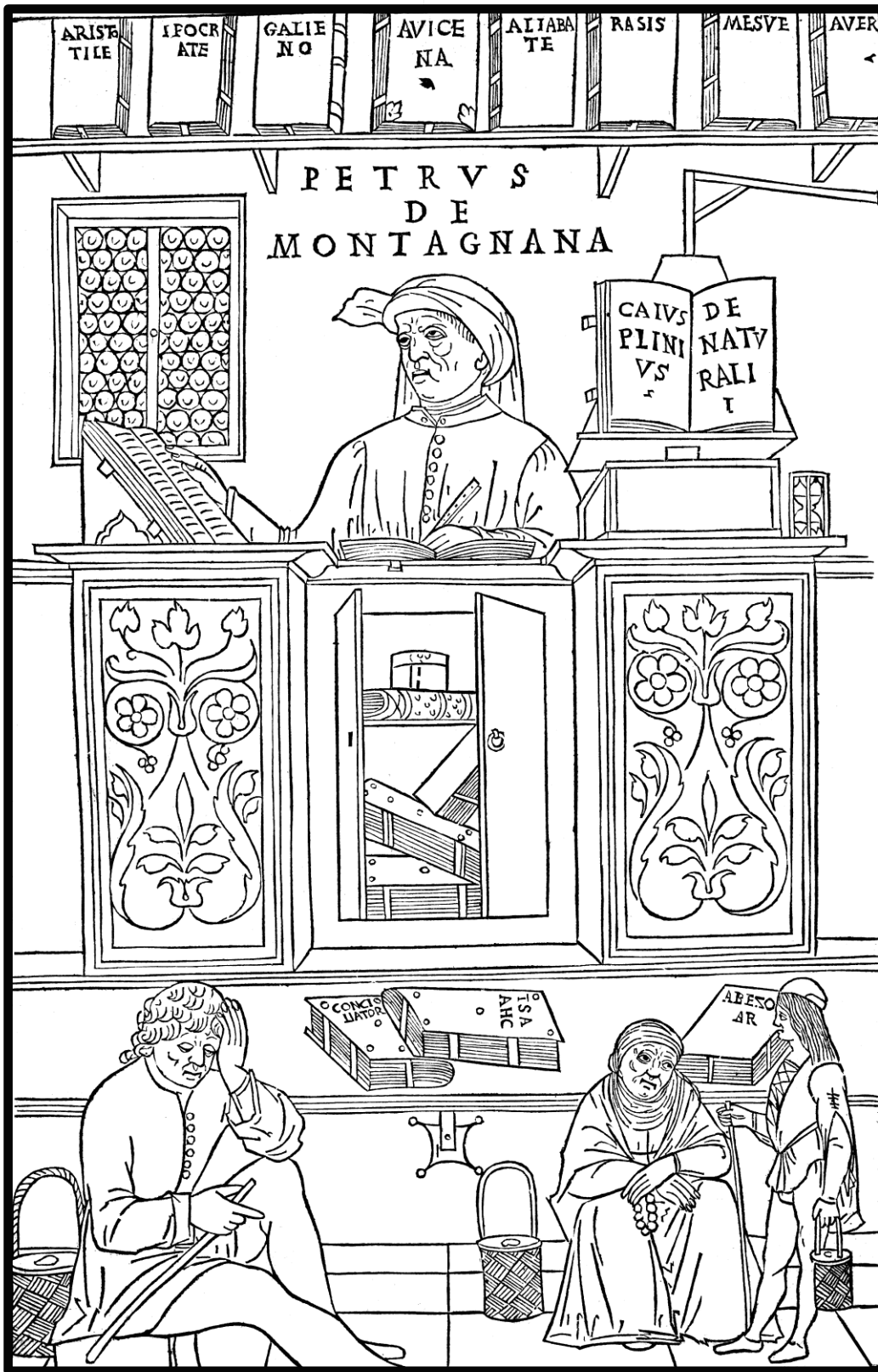




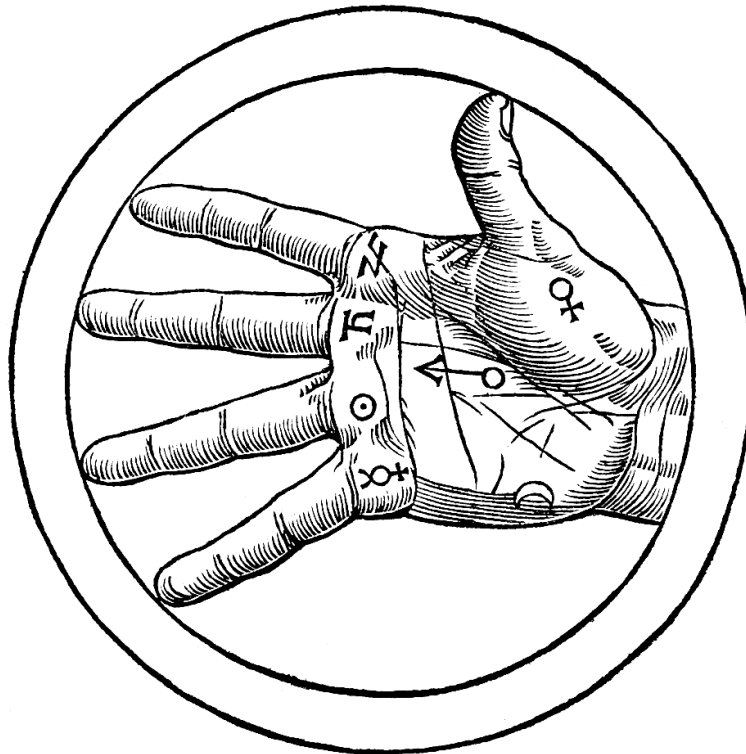
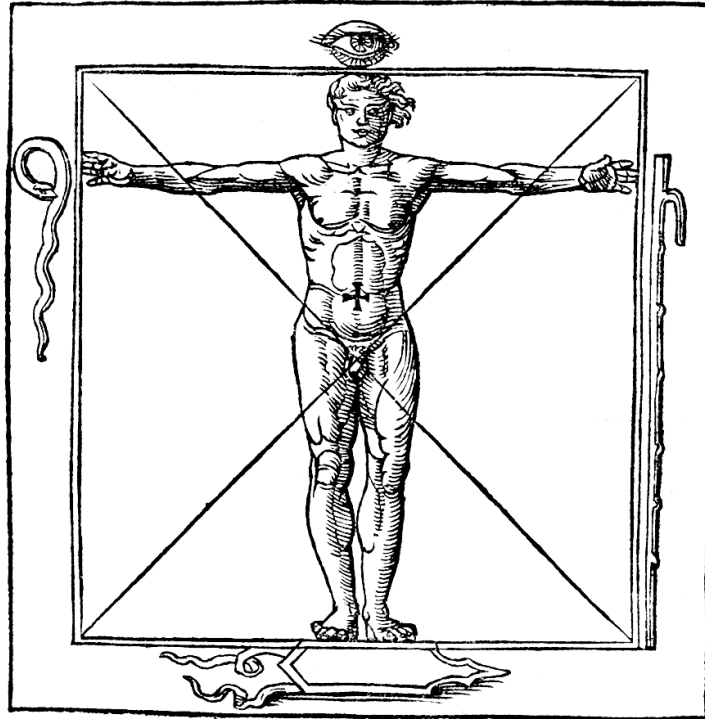
At last he arrived at a castle so grand,

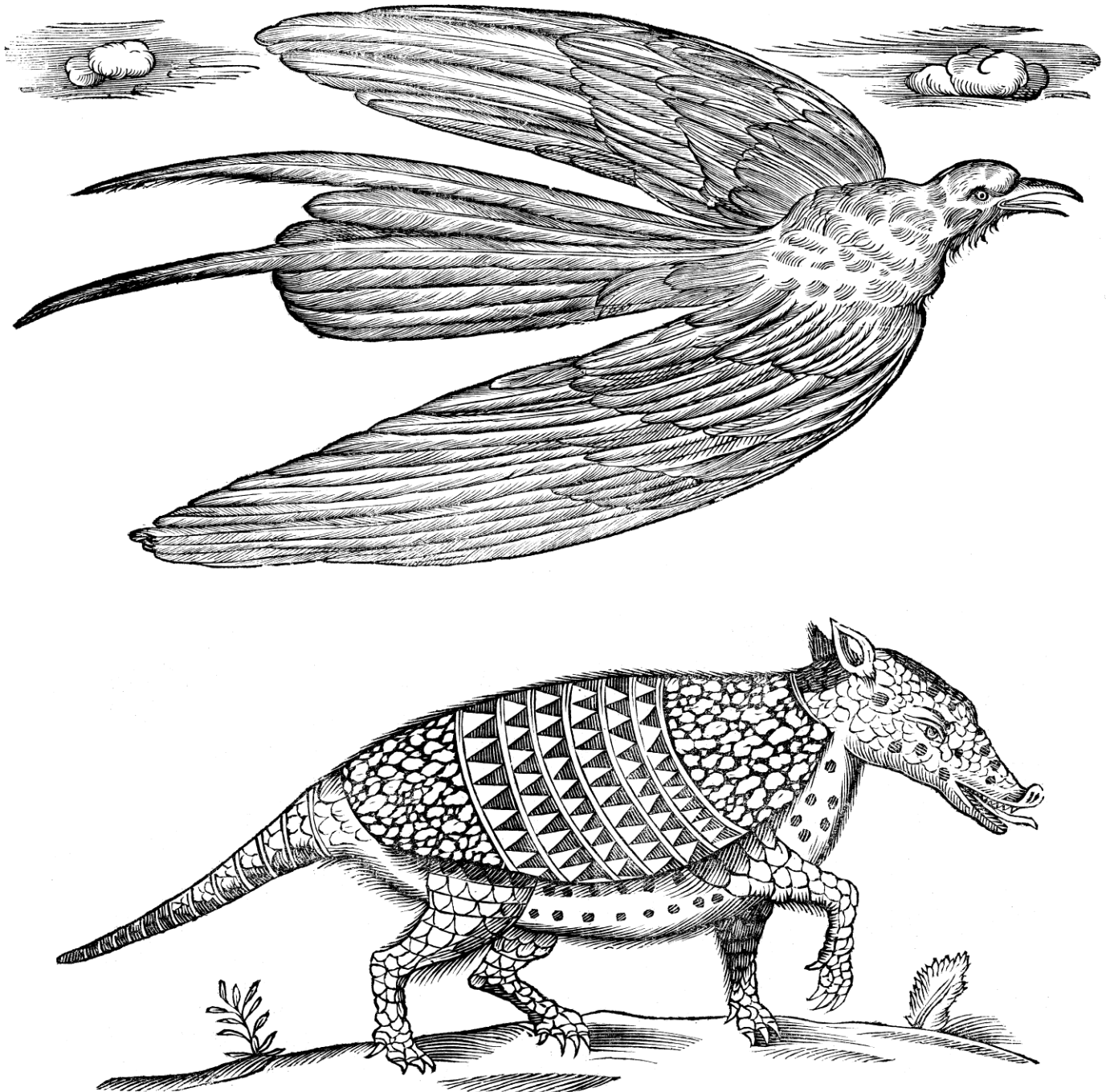
