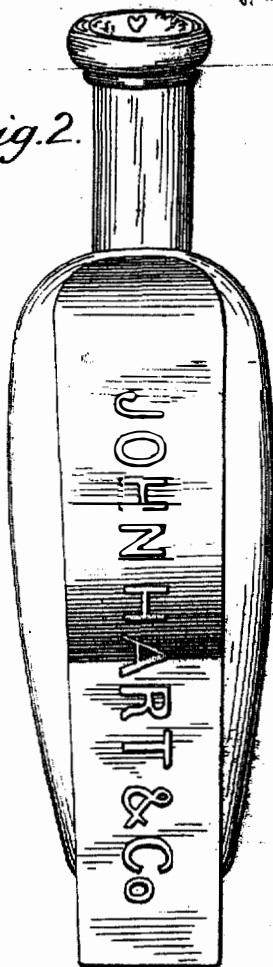

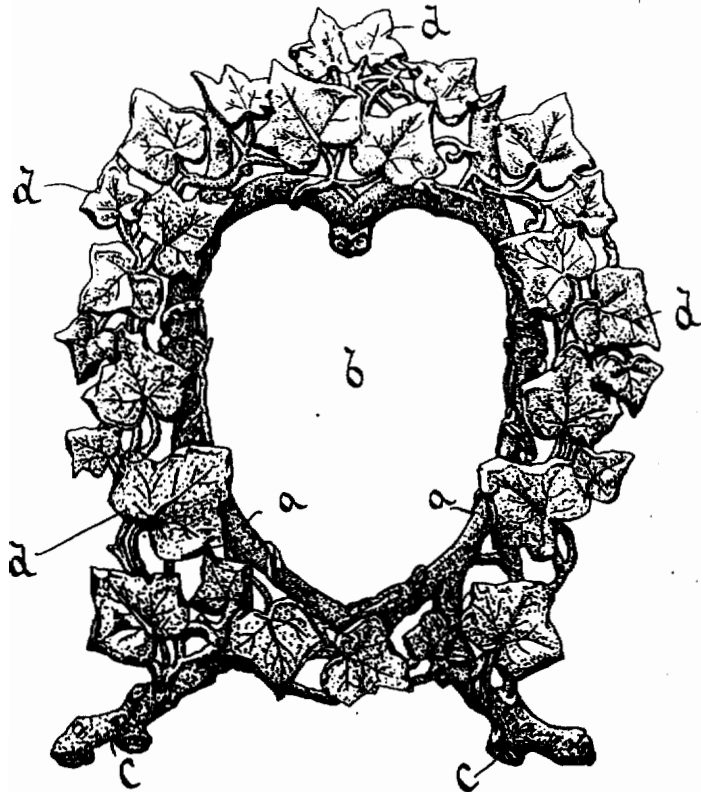

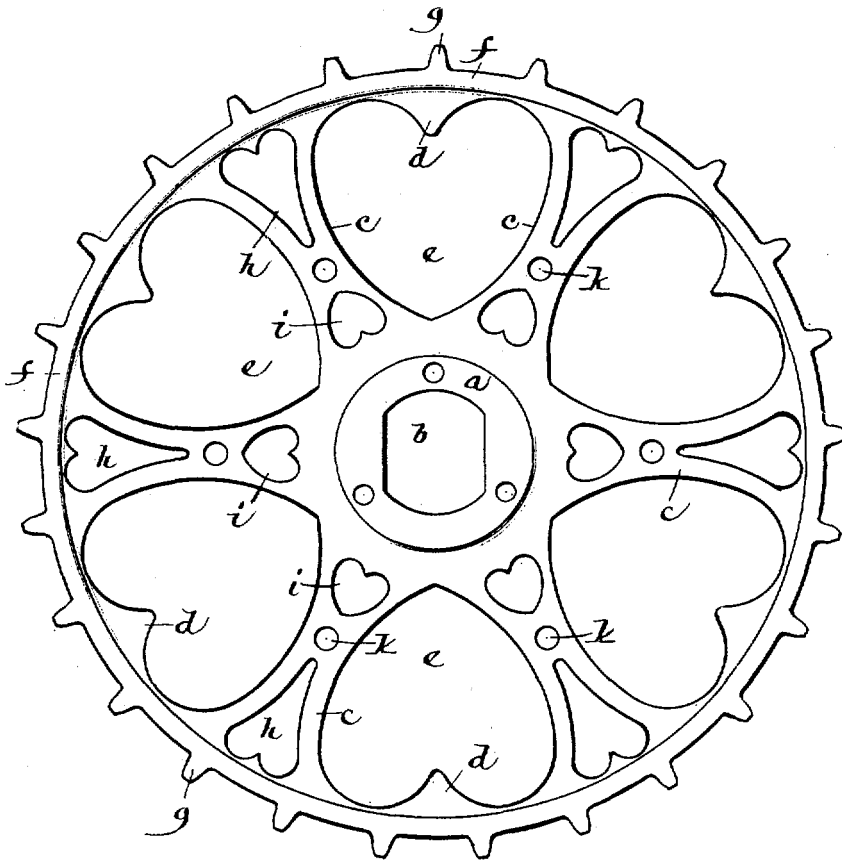
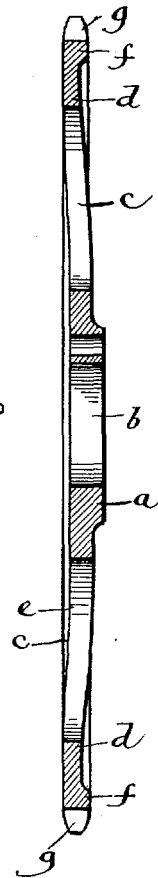

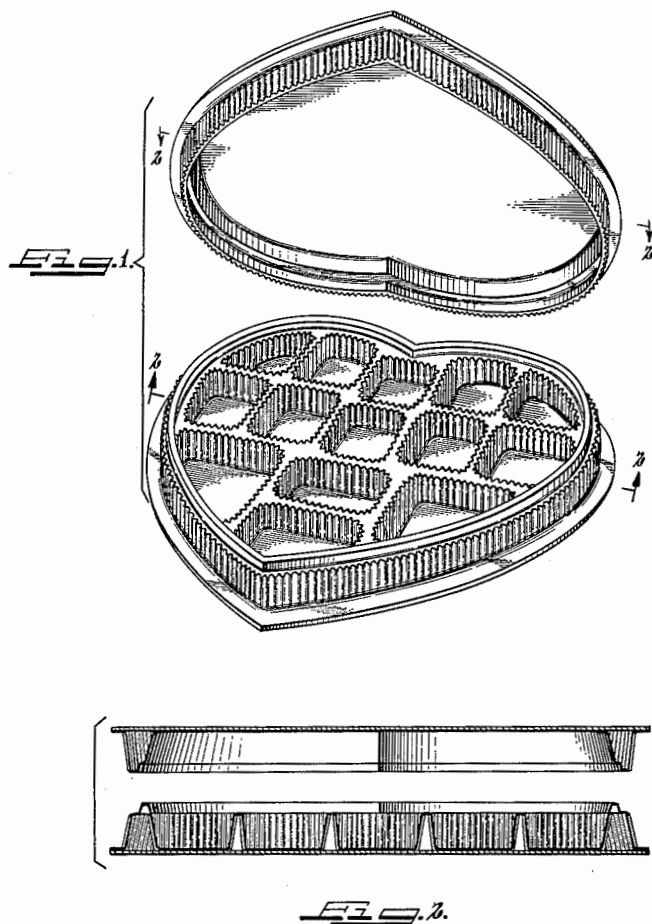


FIGURE 1 is an exploded perspective view of a corrugated heart-shaped confection box embodying my new design; and

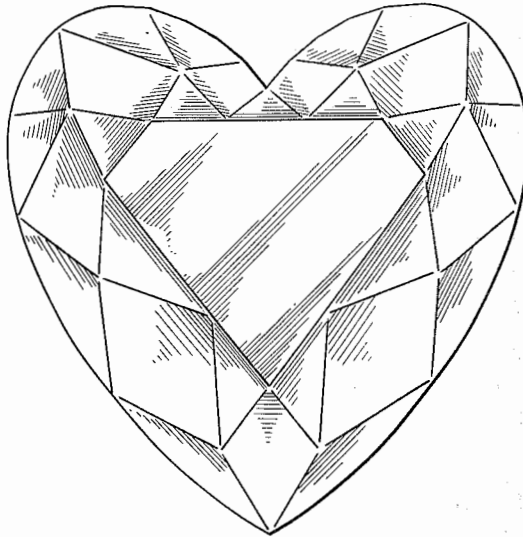

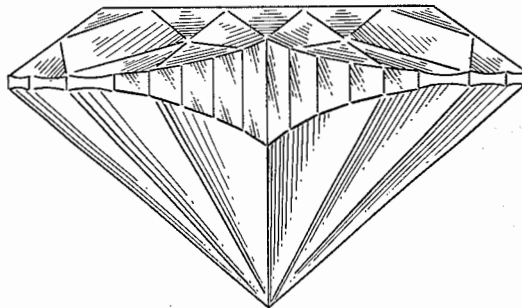


FIG. 1 is a top plan view of a diamond showing my new design; and

FIG. 2 is an end elevational view looking in the direction of the cleft of the heart shape diamond of FIG. 1. That portion of the base not shown extending from the girdle to the bottom of the jewel is faceted identically to the portion shown.

A characteristic feature of the ornamental design of the invention is the heart shape configuration of the girdle of the jewel, the cleft of such configuration being formed of multiple and contiguous facets.

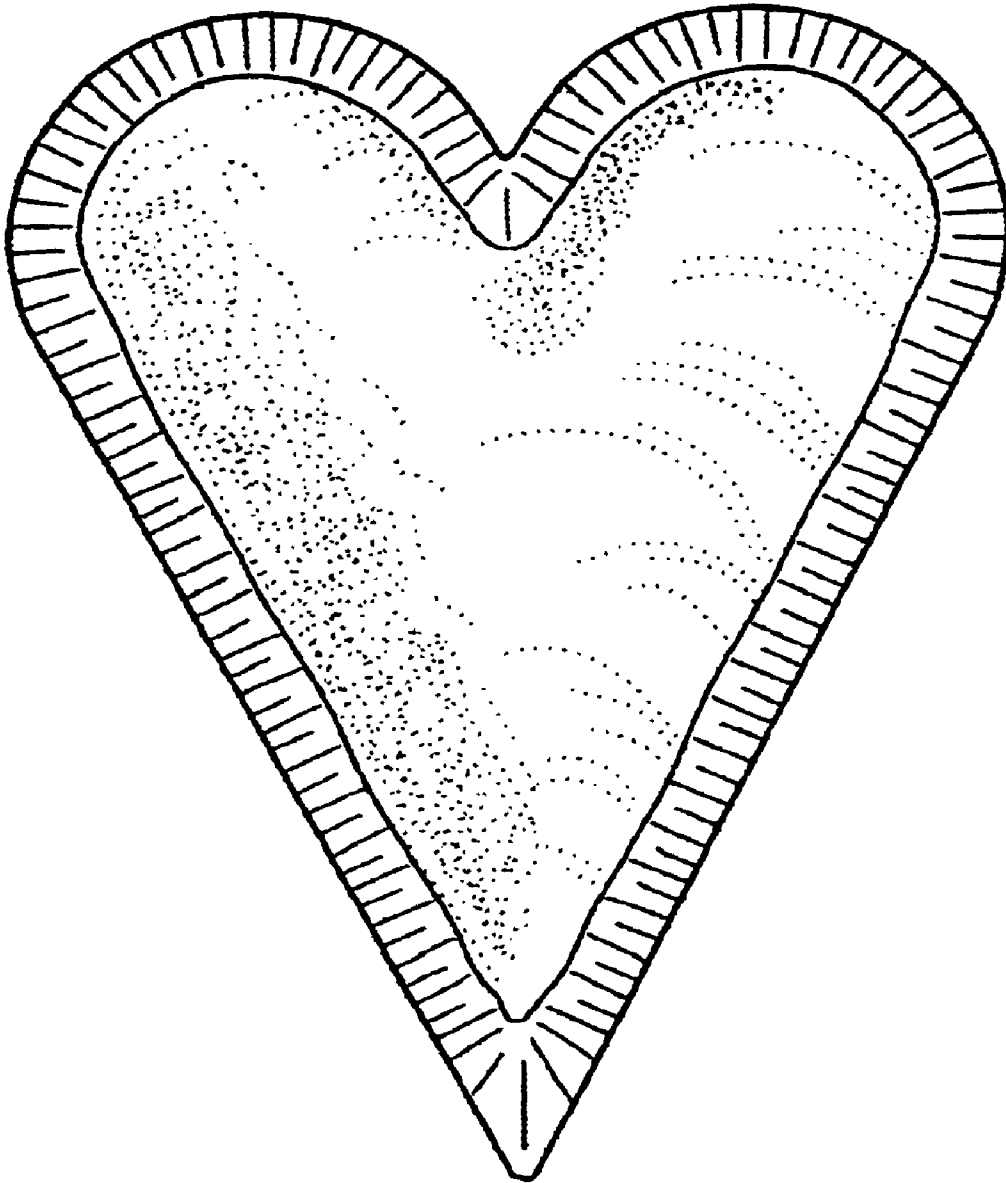

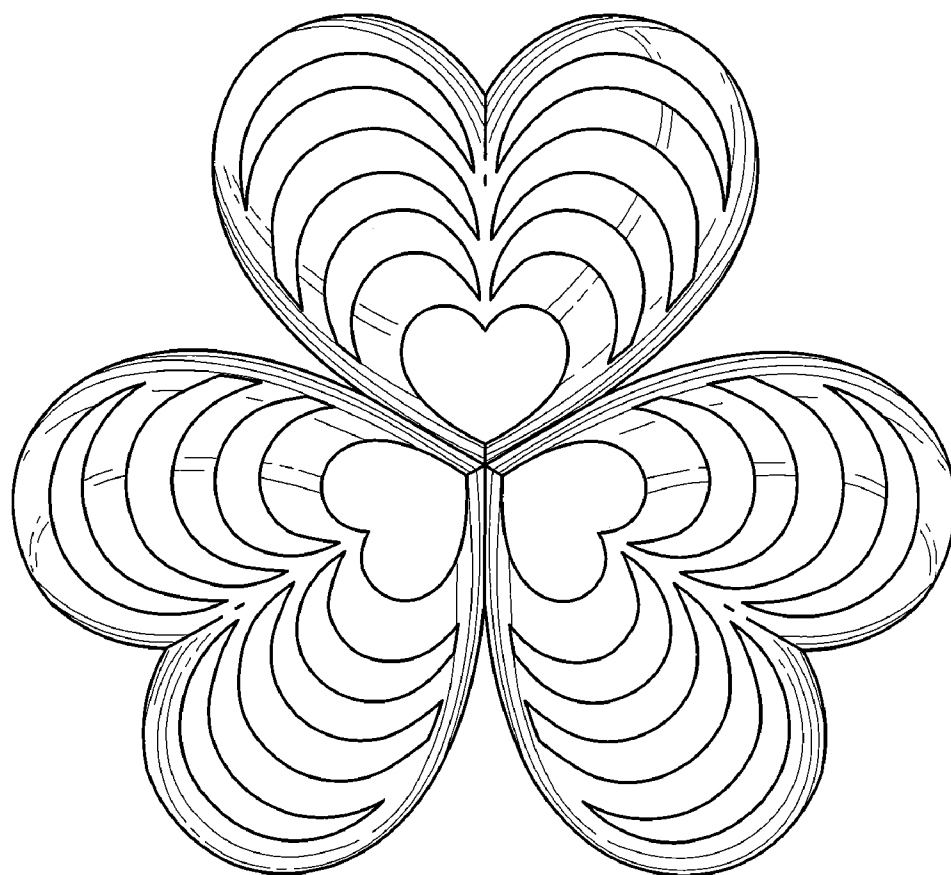

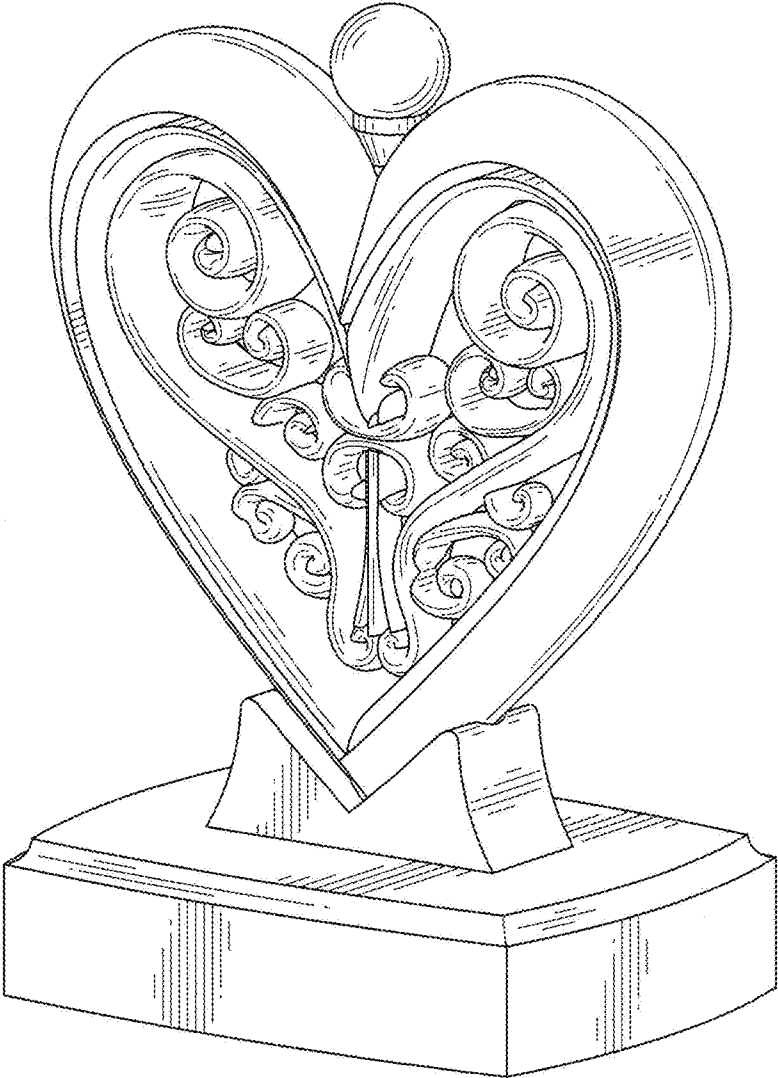

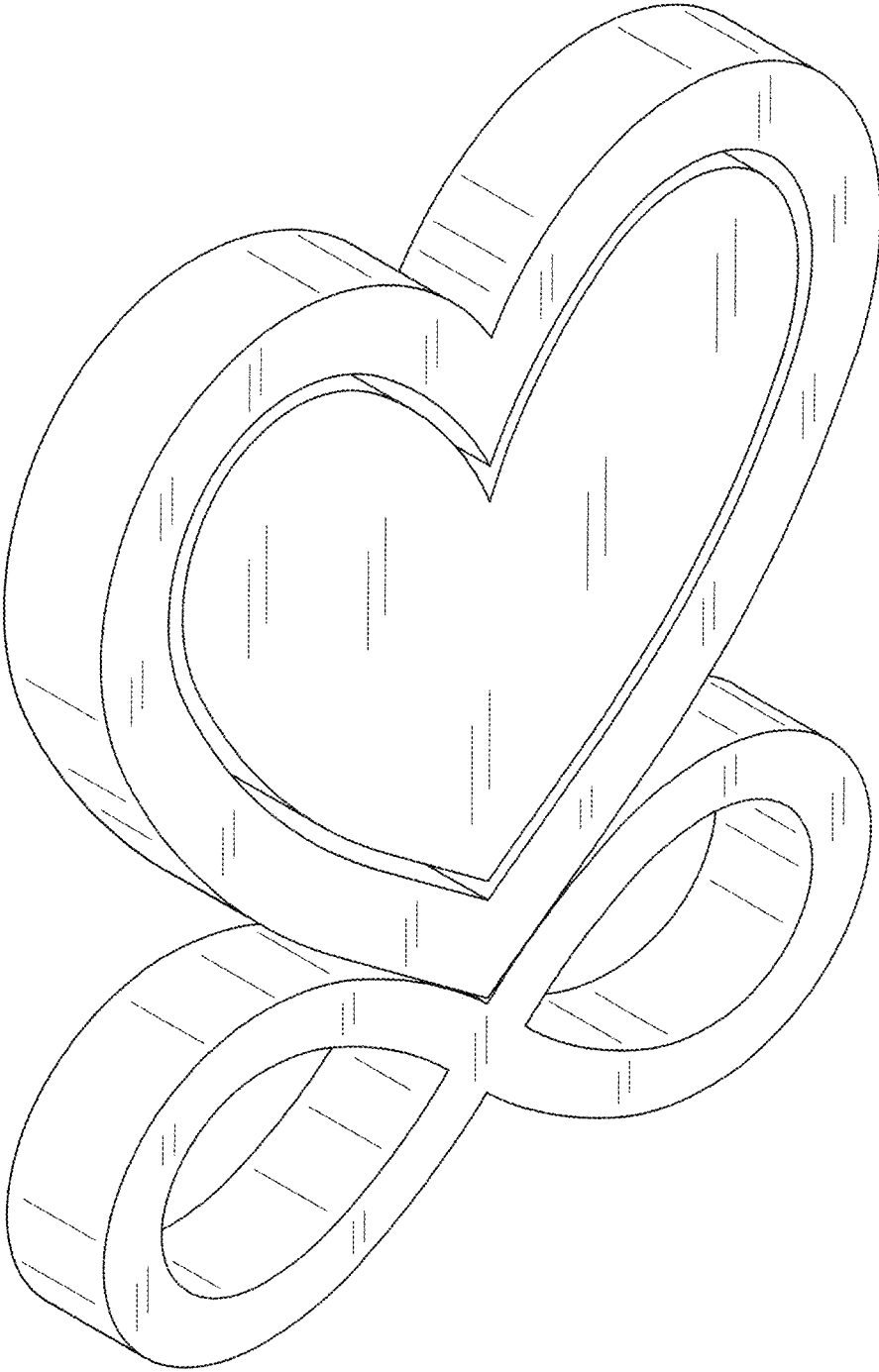
