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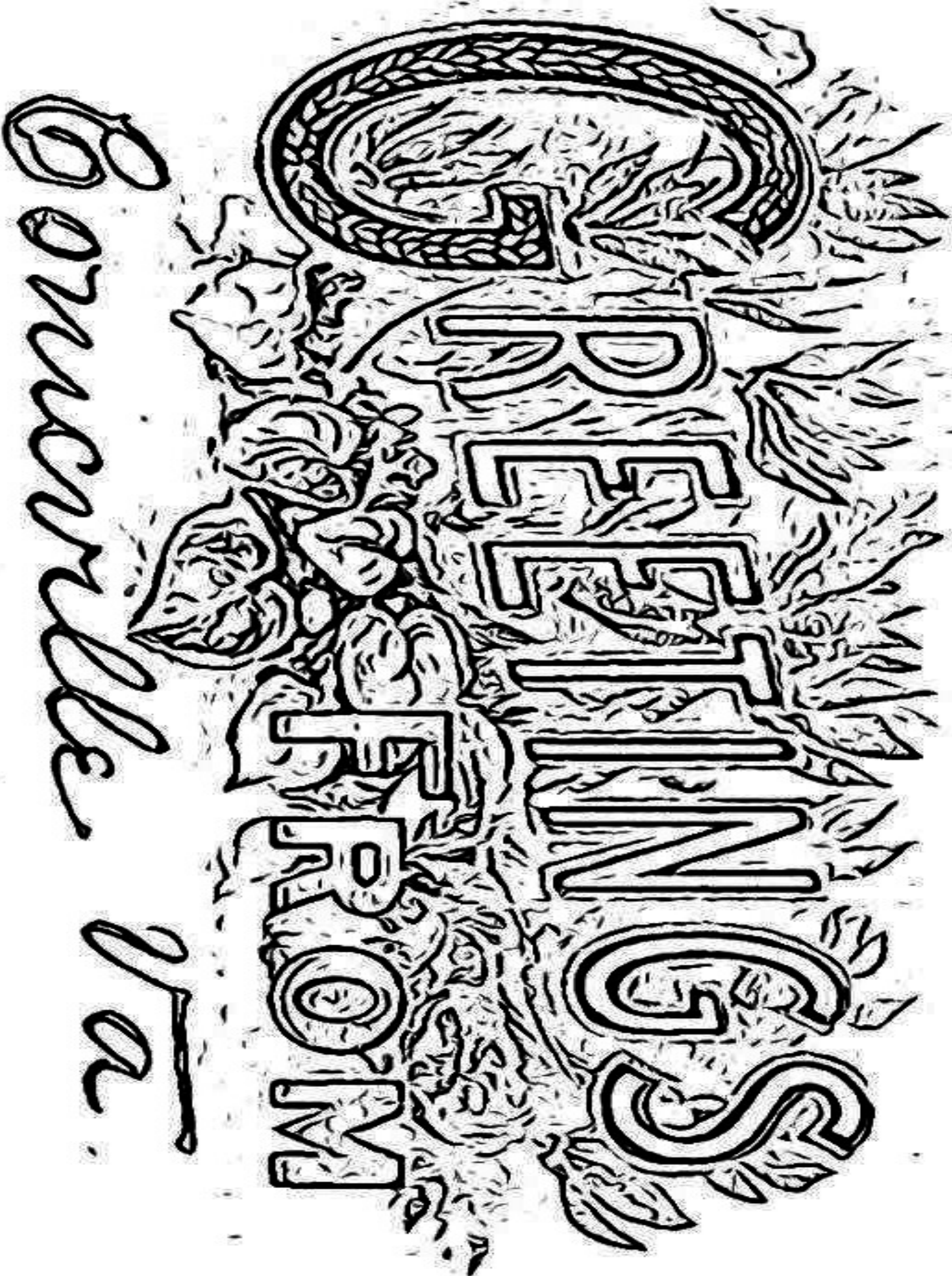
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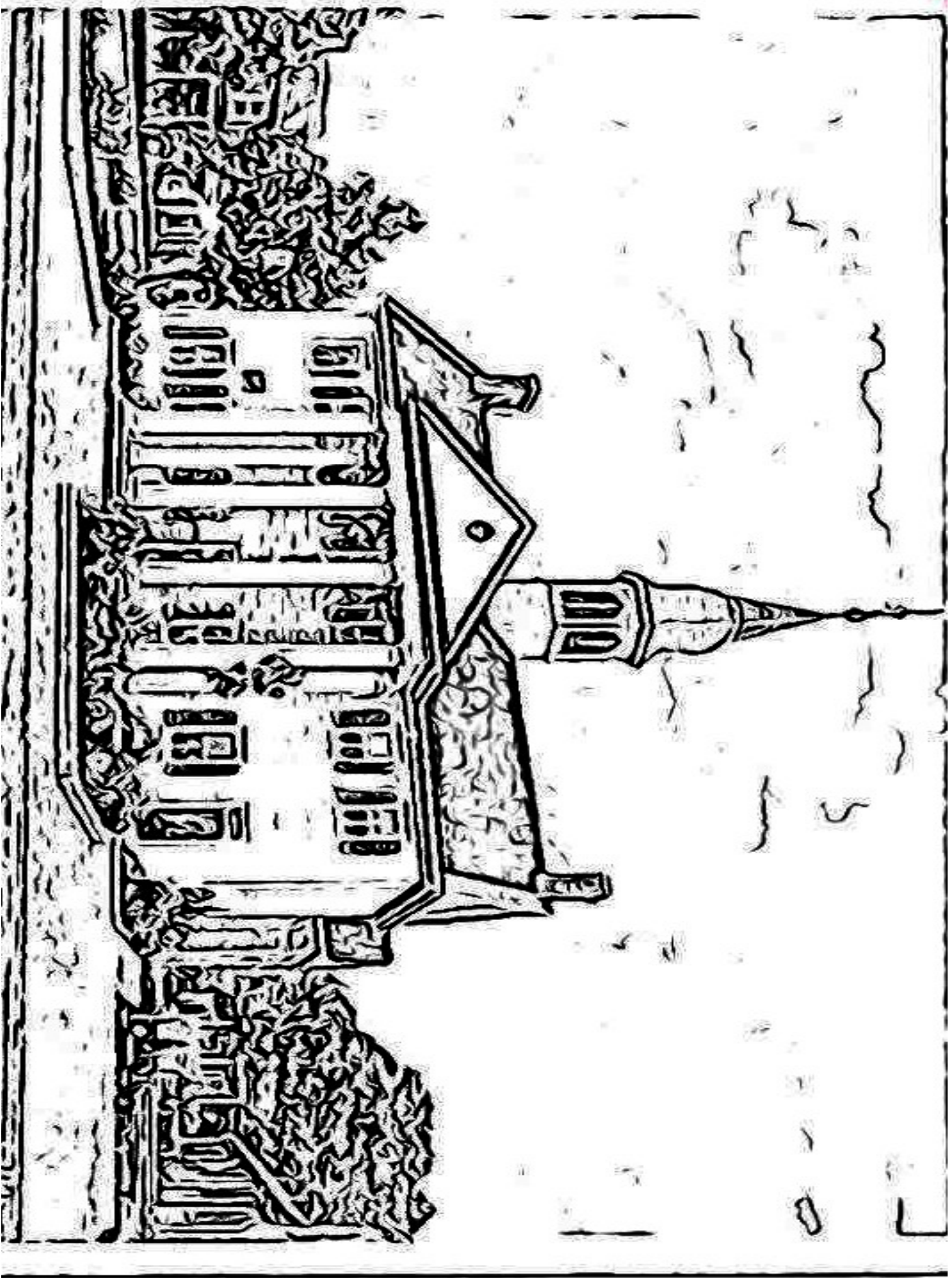
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Postcard from Conicville Virginia. The village is located to the west of Mt. Jackson and was founded in the mid-19th century.

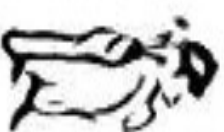

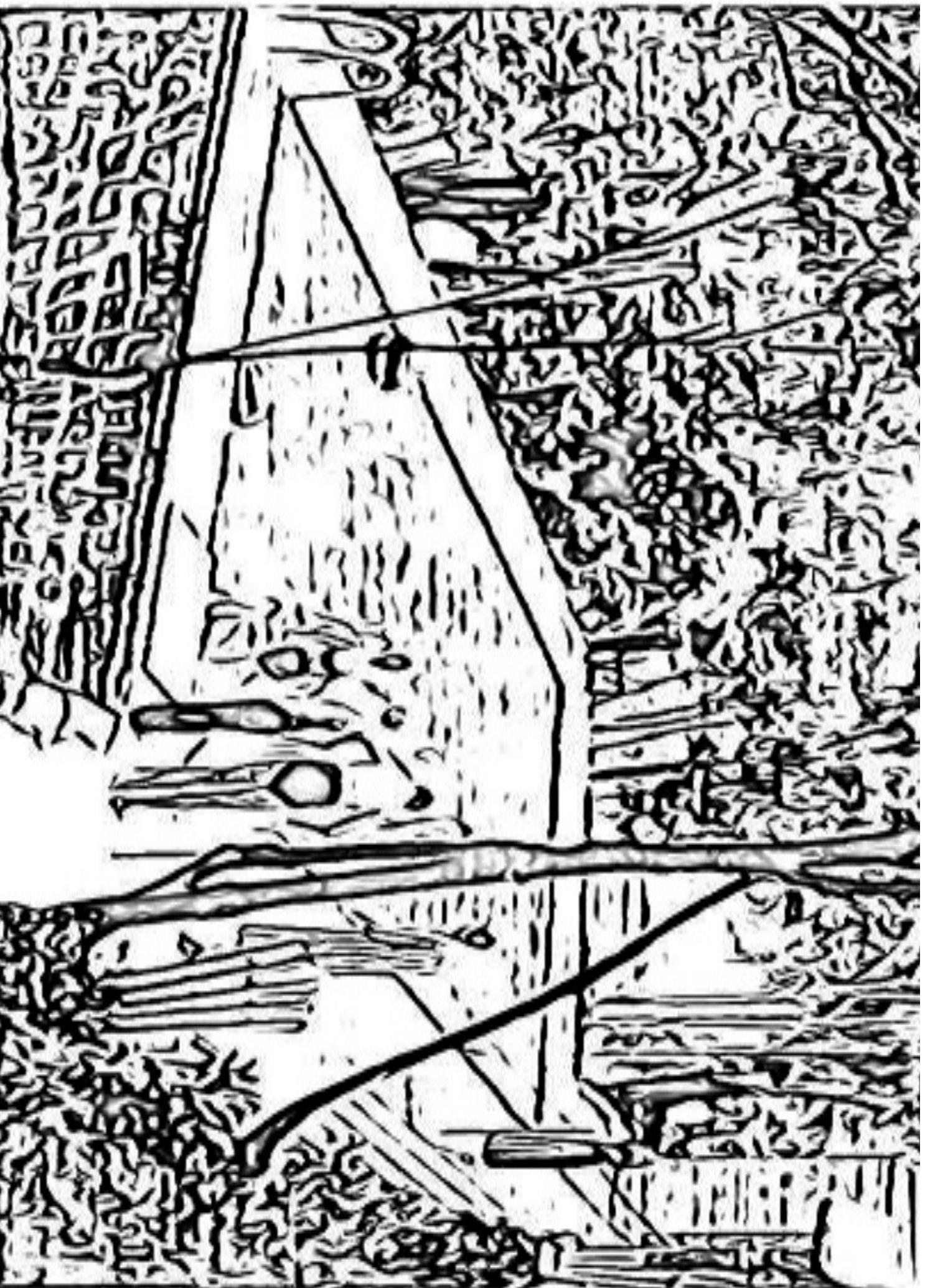

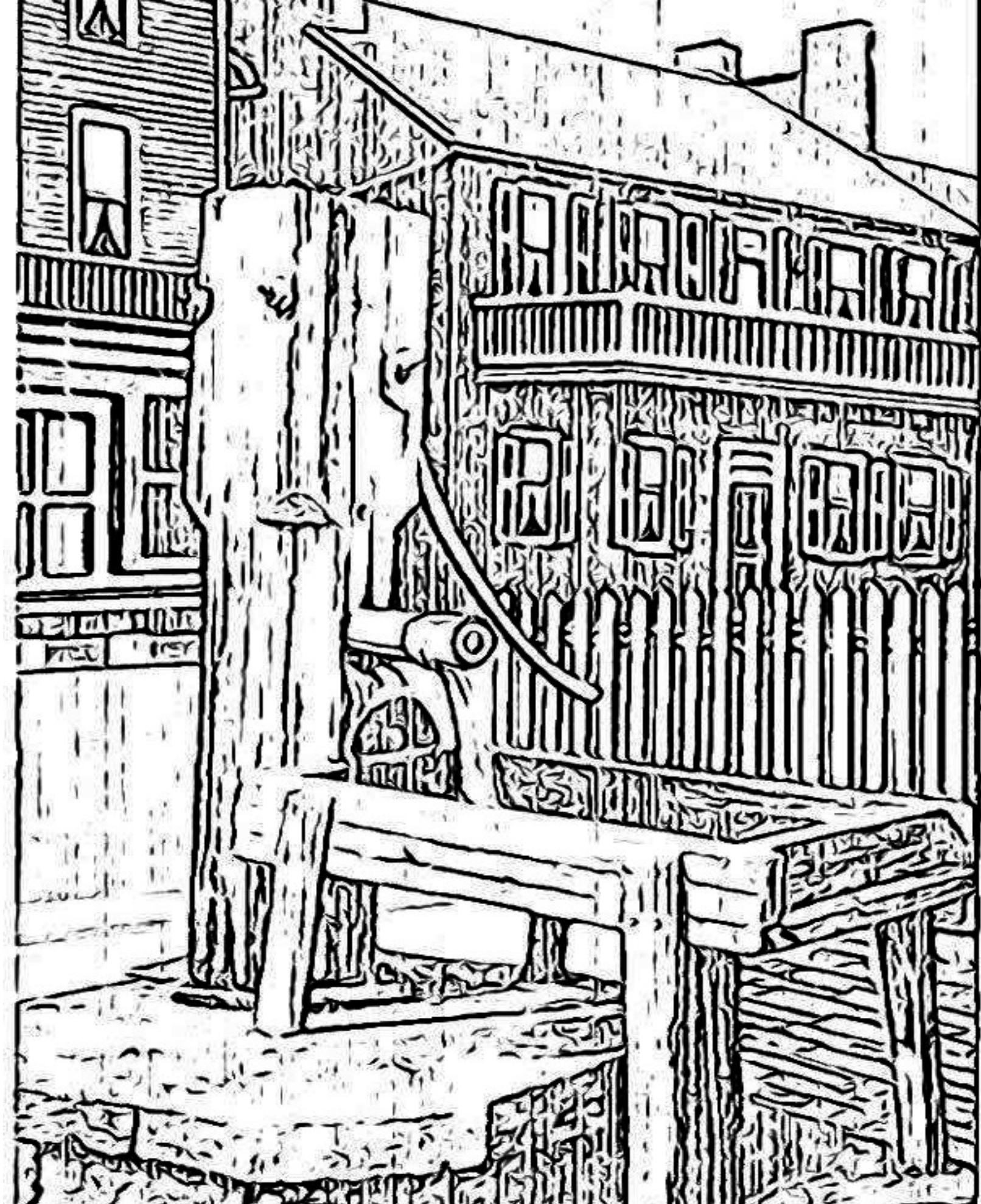
Lots of Shoestring Potatoes

Cave Spring Resort Hotel. Located south of Edinburg Virginia it was a popular site with visitors and locals through the 1950s.



Covered bridge at Meems Bottom near Mt. Jackson. Originally bridged in 1867. Current structure built in 1976 following a fire.



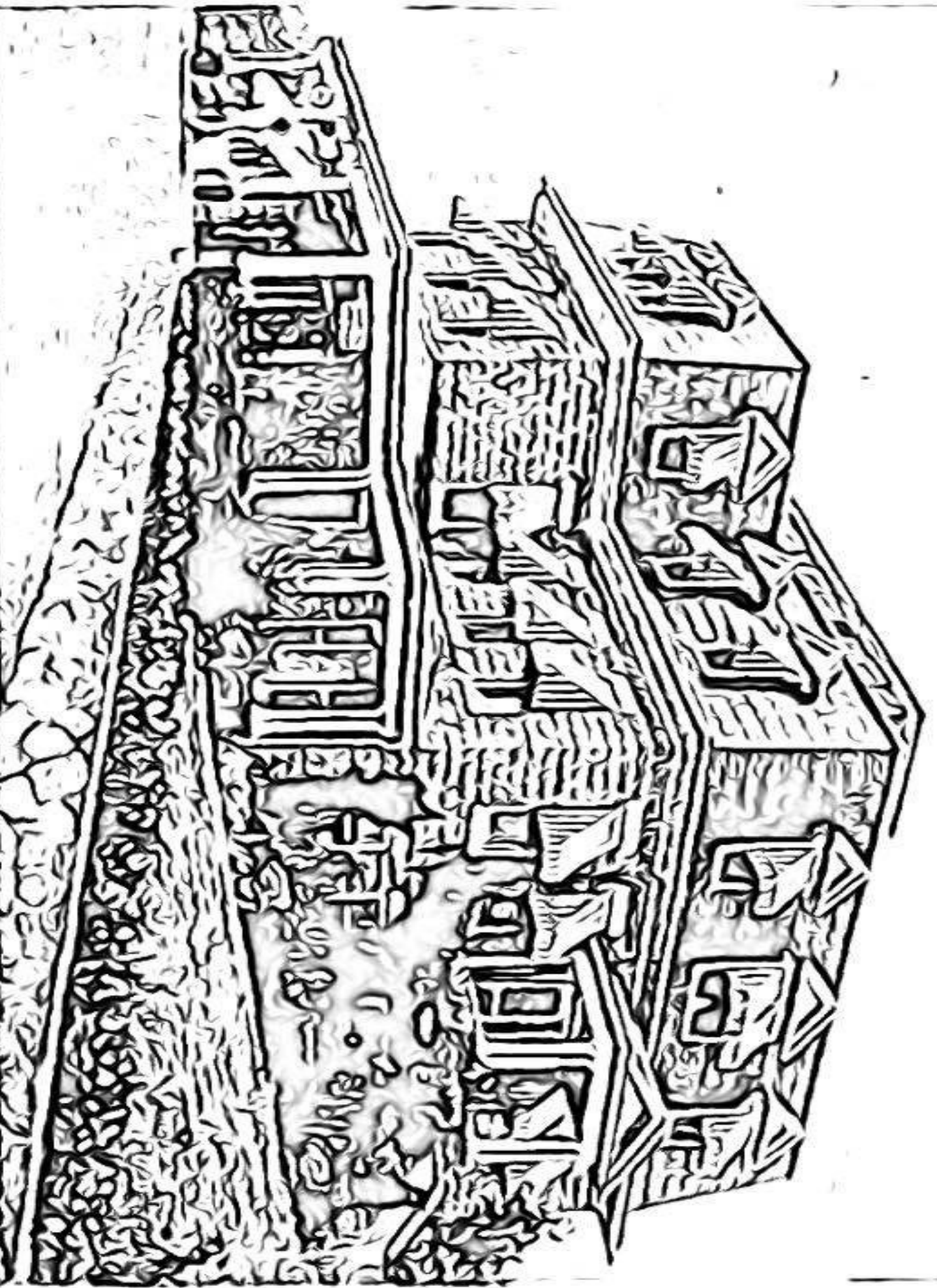
New Market Town Pump, pre-Civil War
Used by residents to acquire water before instillation of waterworks.



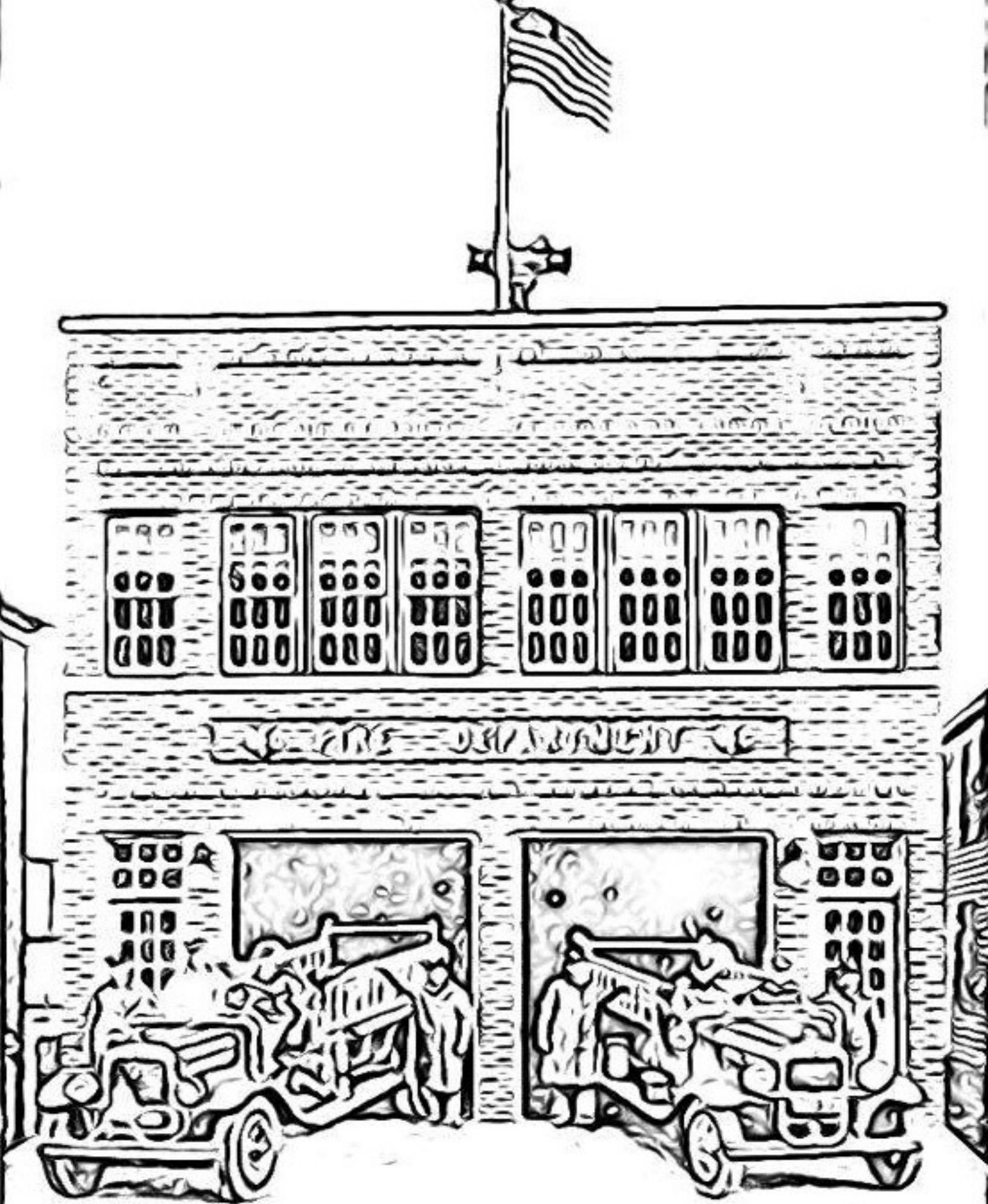
Orkney Springs Hotel constructed ca. 1850.



Strasburg School built 1870 as a private school it housed the High and Elementary Schools until 1959. It closed in 1991.



Shenandoah Caverns Hotel. Built in 1921 to accommodate visitors arriving via the railroad. Closed in 1957 following fire.



Woodstock Fire Department. Founded in 1823. This building constructed in 1931.
