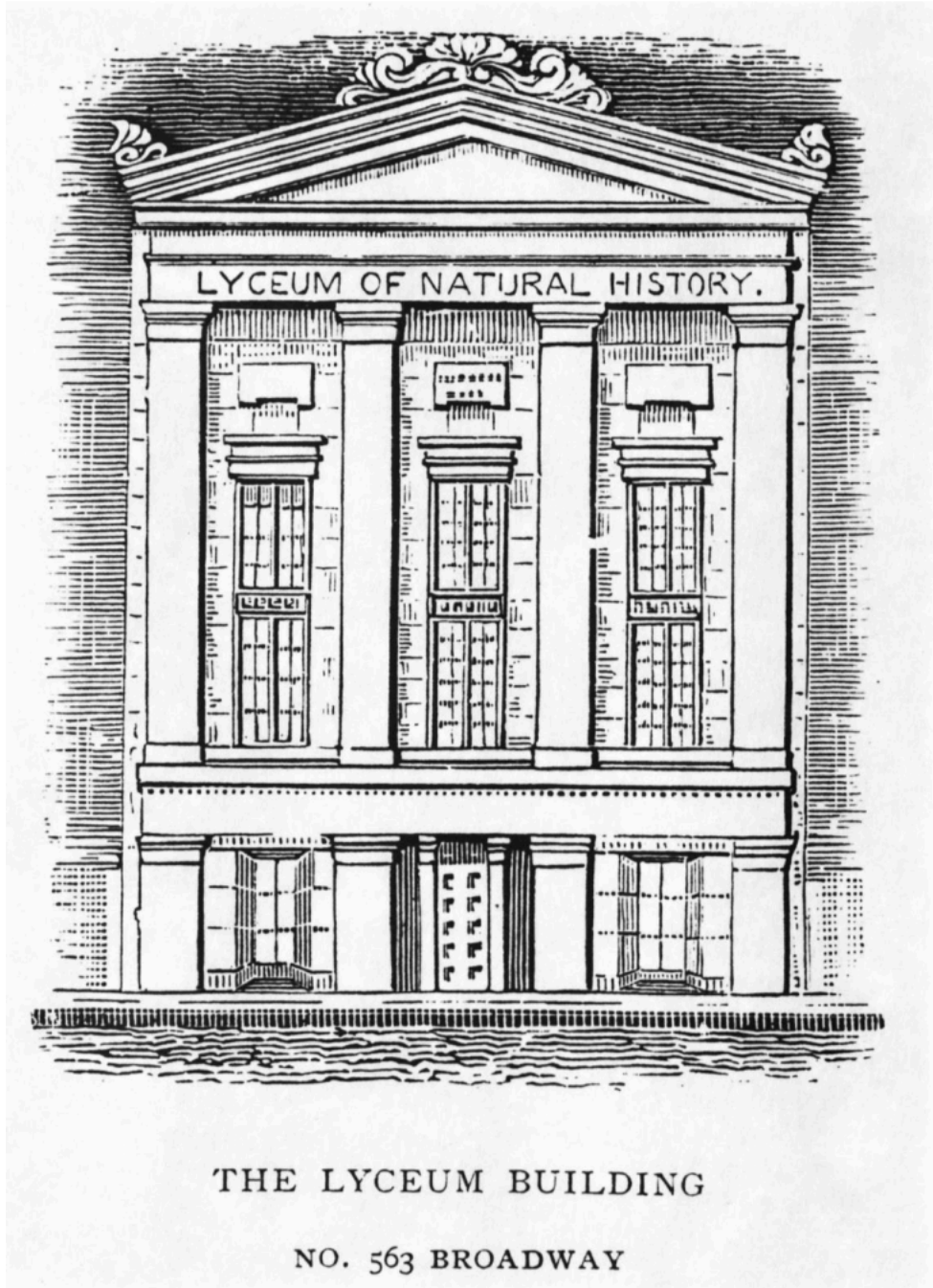

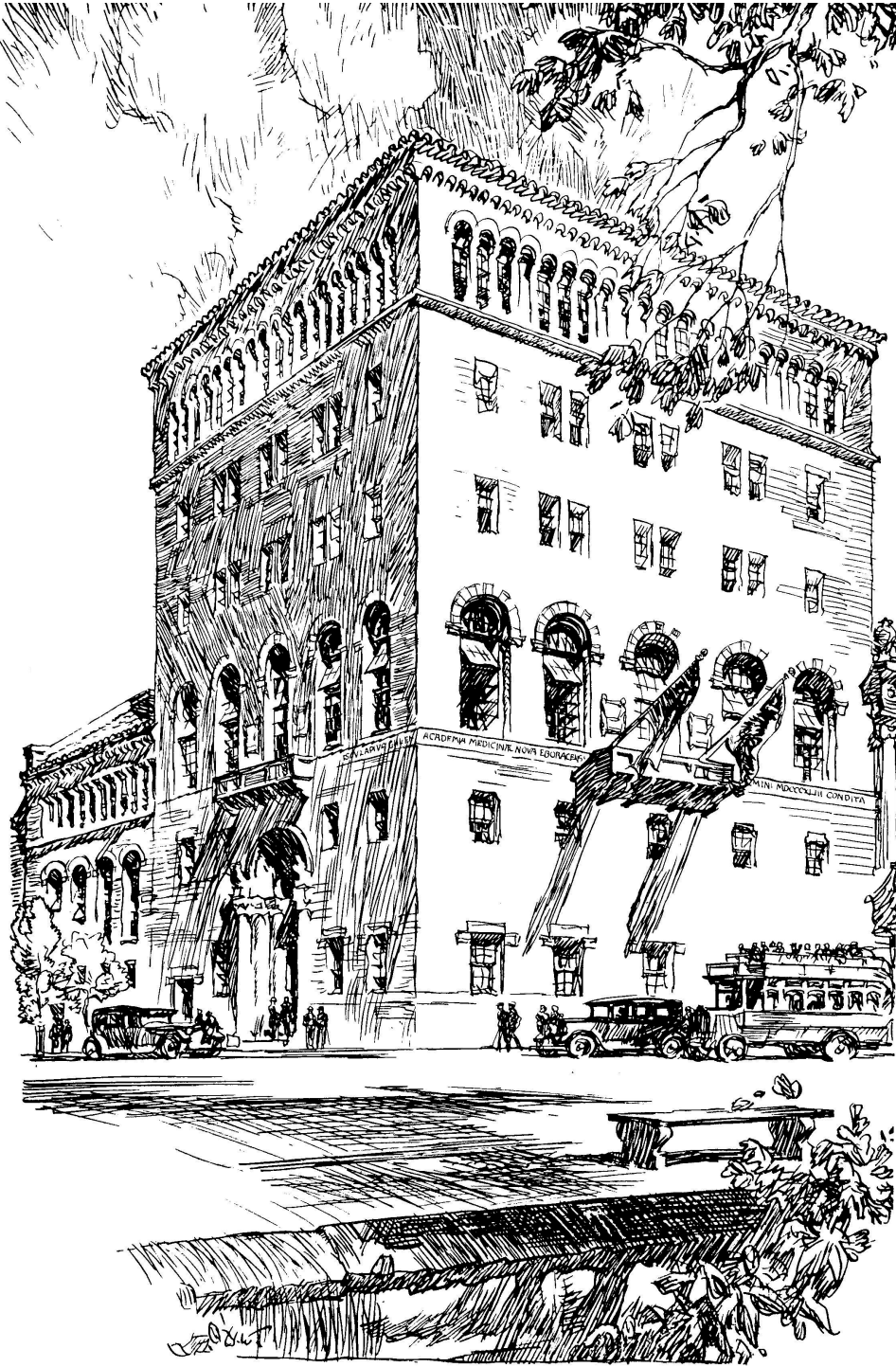

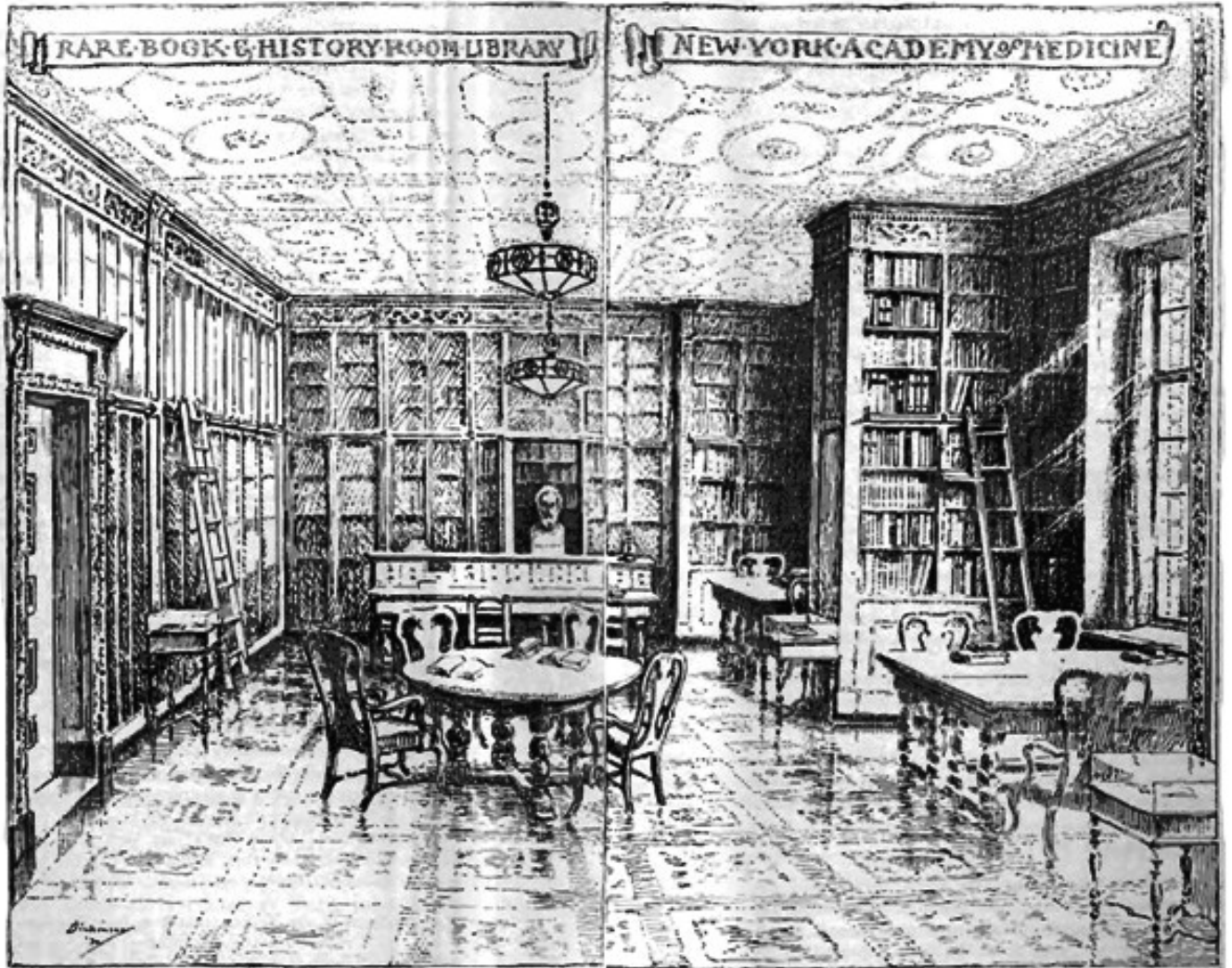

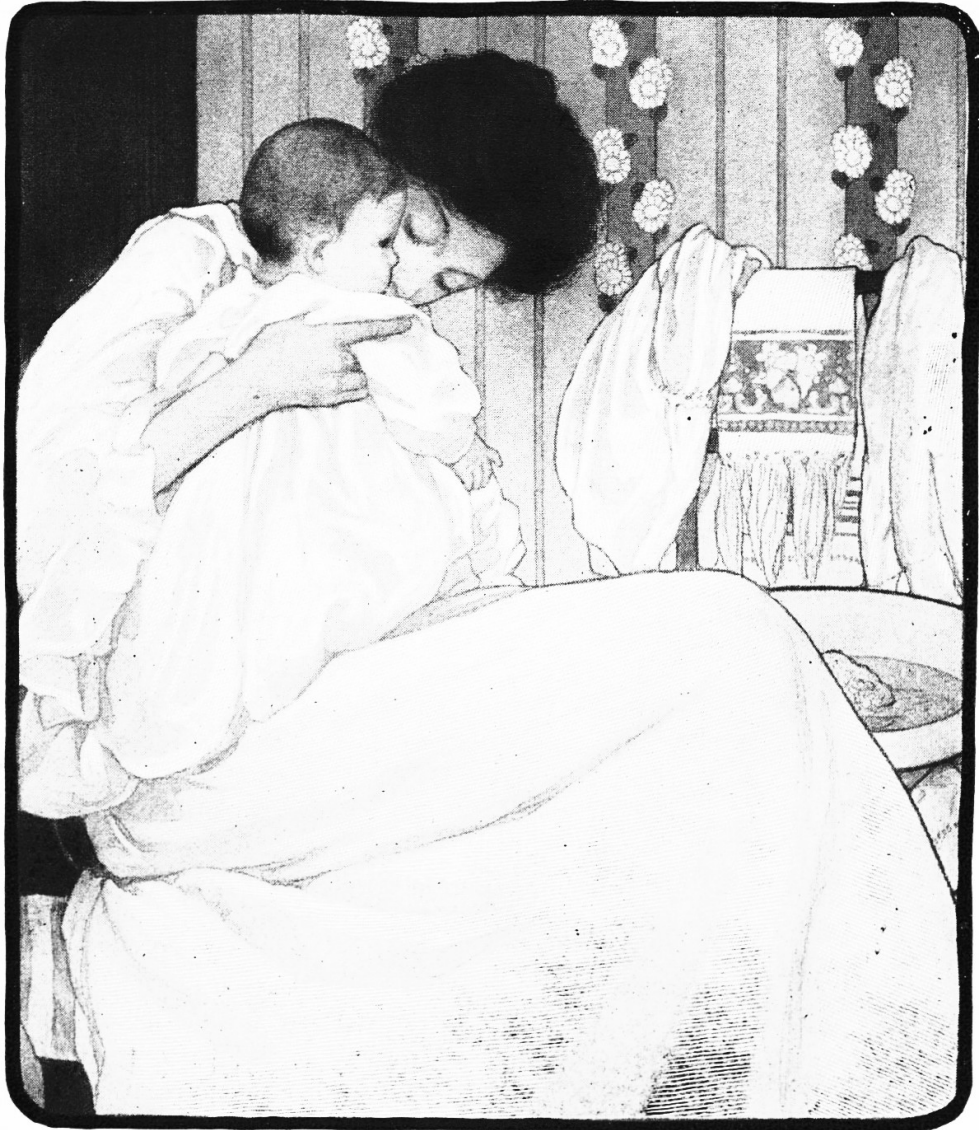

King Garbage, *Harper's Weekly*, v.XXXV, no. 1781 (Saturday, February 7, 1891). Legendary sanitation problems plagued New York City for decades. In the 1920s, the Academy's Committee of Twenty on Street and Outdoor Cleanliness worked to change methods of trash collection and get a professional Department of Sanitation established.

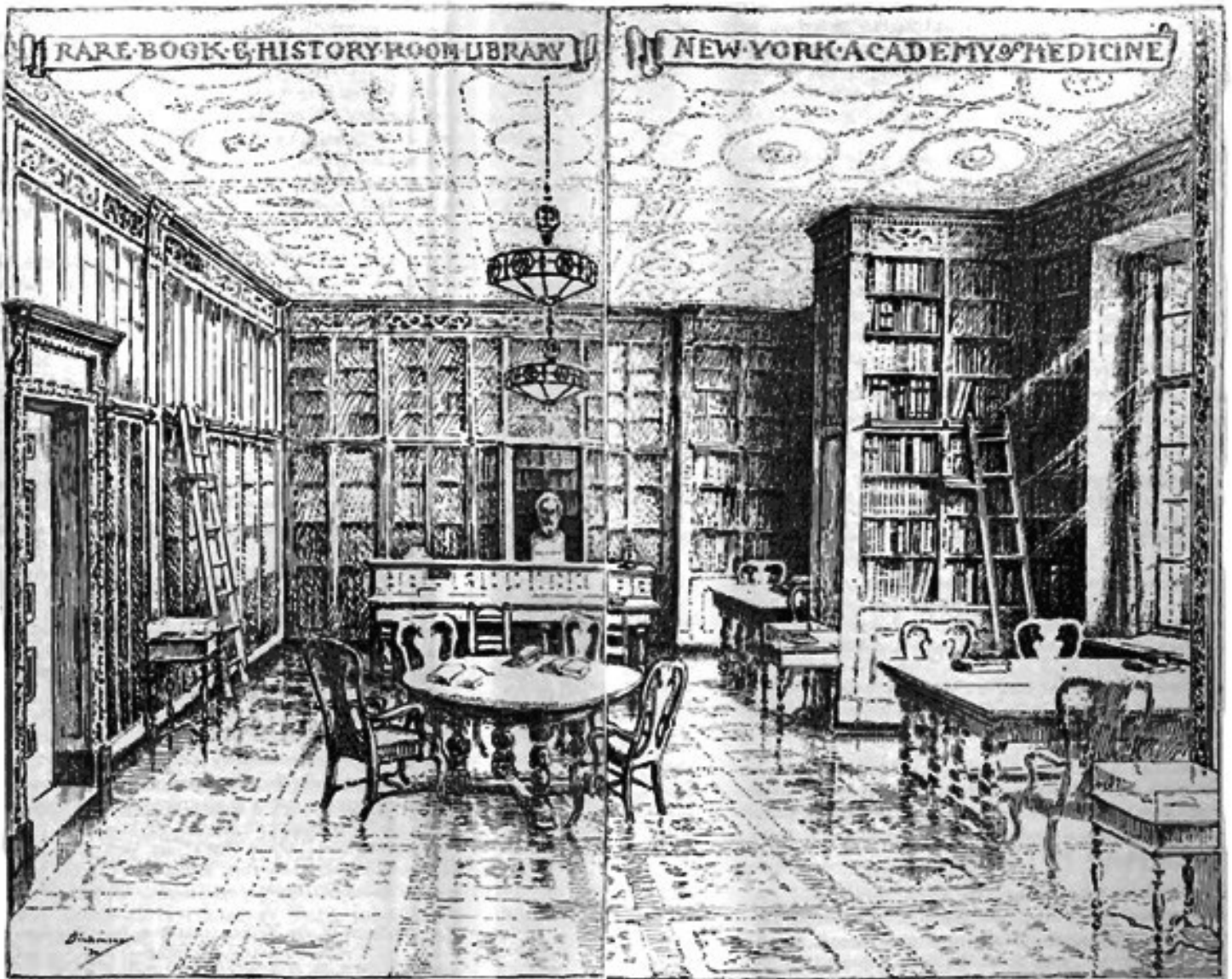
